 1-26 AN ACT

1-27 relating to longevity pay for certain prosecutors.  
 1-28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:  
 1-29 SECTION 1. Section 41.013, Government Code, is amended to  
 1-30 read as follows:  
 1-31 Sec. 41.013. COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN PROSECUTORS. Except  
 1-32 as otherwise provided by law, a district attorney or criminal  
 1-33 district attorney is entitled to receive from the state:  
 1-34 (1) annual compensation in an amount equal to at least  
 1-35 80 percent of the state annual salary as set by the General  
 1-36 Appropriations Act in accordance with Section 659.012 paid to a  
 1-37 district judge with comparable years of service as the district  
 1-38 attorney or criminal district attorney; and  
 1-39 (2) a monthly amount of longevity pay based on the  
 1-40 district attorney's or criminal district attorney's years of  
 1-41 service that would be paid to the district attorney or criminal  
 1-42 district attorney under Section 659.0445 if the district attorney  
 1-43 or criminal district attorney were a judge or justice described by  
 1-44 Section 659.0445(a).  
 1-45 SECTION 2. Section 46.003(a), Government Code, is amended  
 1-46 to read as follows:  
 1-47 (a) The state prosecuting attorney and each state  
 1-48 prosecutor is entitled to receive from the state:  
 1-49 (1) a salary in an amount equal to the state annual  
 1-50 salary as set by the General Appropriations Act in accordance with  
 1-51 Section 659.012 paid to a district judge with comparable years of  
 1-52 service as the state prosecuting attorney or state prosecutor; and  
 1-53 (2) a monthly amount of longevity pay based on the  
 1-54 state prosecuting attorney's or state prosecutor's years of service  
 1-55 that would be paid to the state prosecuting attorney or state  
 1-56 prosecutor under Section 659.0445 if the state prosecuting attorney  
 1-57 or state prosecutor were a judge or justice described by Section  
 1-58 659.0445(a).  
 1-59 SECTION 3. Sections 41.013 and 46.003(a), Government Code,  
 1-60 as amended by this Act, apply beginning with the first pay period  
 1-61 that begins on or after the effective date of this Act.

2-1 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
