## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to compensation for the streamlined expedited release of 3 certain areas from a certificate of public convenience and 4 necessity.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Sections 13.2541(g), and (i), Water Code, are 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (q) The monetary amount of compensation, if any, shall be determined by a qualified individual or firm serving as independent 9 appraiser agreed upon by the certificate holder and the petitioner. 10 The determination of compensation by the independent appraiser 11 12 shall be conducted in compliance with the Uniform Standards of 13 Professional Appraisal Practice and is binding on the utility commission. The costs of the independent appraiser shall be borne 14 by the petitioner. 15

If the petitioner and the certificate holder cannot 16 (i) 17 agree on an independent appraiser within 10 calendar days after the date on which the utility commission approves the petition, the 18 petitioner and the certificate holder shall each engage its own 19 appraiser at its own expense, and each appraisal shall be submitted 20 21 to the utility commission within 70 calendar days after the date on 22 which the utility commission approves the petition. After receiving the appraisals, the utility commission shall appoint a third 23 24 appraiser who shall make a determination of the compensation within

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1 100 days after the date on which the utility commission approves the 2 petition. The determination may not be less than the lower 3 appraisal or more than the higher appraisal. The petitioner and the 4 certificate holder shall each pay half the cost of the third 5 appraisal. <u>An appraisal under this subsection must be conducted in</u> 6 <u>compliance with the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal</u> 7 Practice.

SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 8 9 a proceeding affecting a certificate of public convenience and necessity that commences on or after the effective date of this Act. 10 A proceeding affecting a certificate of public convenience and 11 necessity that commenced before the effective date of this Act is 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the proceeding is 13 commenced, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. 14 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
