A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to recommendations by local school health advisory councils regarding opioid addiction and abuse education in public 3 schools. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 28.004(c), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (c) The local school health advisory council's duties 8 9 include recommending: the number of hours of instruction to be provided 10 (1)11 in: 12 (A) health education in kindergarten through 13 grade eight; and 14 (B) if the school district requires health education for high school graduation, health education, including 15 16 physical health education and mental health education, in grades 9 17 through 12; 18 (2) policies, procedures, strategies, and curriculum appropriate for specific grade levels designed to prevent physical 19 20 health concerns, including obesity, cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, and mental health concerns, including suicide, through 21 coordination of: 22 23 (A) health education, which must address physical health concerns and mental health concerns to ensure the 24

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1 organizations or agencies;

2 (6) strategies to increase parental awareness
3 regarding:

4 (A) risky behaviors and early warning signs of
5 suicide risks and behavioral health concerns, including mental
6 health disorders and substance use disorders; and

7 (B) available community programs and services
8 that address risky behaviors, suicide risks, and behavioral health
9 concerns;

10 (7) appropriate grade levels and curriculum for 11 instruction regarding <u>the dangers of opioids</u>, <u>including</u> 12 <u>instruction on</u>:

13 <u>(A)</u> opioid addiction and abuse, including 14 <u>addiction to and abuse of synthetic opioids such as fentanyl;</u> and 15 <u>(B)</u> methods of administering an opioid 16 antagonist, as defined by Section 483.101, Health and Safety Code; 17 and

(8) appropriate grade levels and curriculum 18 for 19 instruction regarding child abuse, family violence, dating violence, and sex trafficking, including likely warning signs that 20 a child may be at risk for sex trafficking, provided that the local 21 school health advisory council's recommendations under this 22 23 subdivision do not conflict with the essential knowledge and skills 24 developed by the State Board of Education under this subchapter.

25 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

2 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
