- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 42.042(e), Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (e) The executive commissioner shall promulgate minimum
- 9 standards that apply to licensed child-care facilities and to
- 10 registered family homes covered by this chapter and that will:
- 11 (1) promote the health, safety, and welfare of
- 12 children attending a facility or registered family home;
- 13 (2) promote safe, comfortable, and healthy physical
- 14 facilities and registered family homes for children;
- 15 (3) ensure adequate supervision of children by
- 16 capable, qualified, and healthy personnel;
- 17 (4) ensure adequate and healthy food service where
- 18 food service is offered;
- 19 (5) prohibit [racial] discrimination based on race or
- 20 <u>disability</u> by child-care facilities and registered family homes;
- 21 (6) require procedures for parental and guardian
- 22 consultation in the formulation of children's educational and
- 23 therapeutic programs;
- 24 (7) prevent the breakdown of foster care and adoptive

2	(8) ensure that a child-care facility or registered	
3	family home:	
4	(A) follows the directions of a child's physician	
5	or other health care provider in providing specialized medical	
6	assistance required by the child; and	
7	(B) maintains for a reasonable time a copy of any	
8	directions from the physician or provider that the parent provides	
9	to the facility or home; and	
10	(9) ensure that a child's health, safety, and welfare	
11	are adequately protected on the grounds of a child-care facility or	
12	registered family home.	
13	SECTION 2. Section 42.0421, Human Resources Code, is	
14	amended by adding Subsections $(a-1)$ and $(a-2)$ to read as follows:	
15	(a-1) The initial training described by Subsection (a)(1)	
16	<pre>must include training on:</pre>	
17	(1) trauma-informed care; and	
18	(2) behavioral health that includes:	
19	(A) methods for:	
20	(i) understanding and managing behaviors;	
21	(ii) requesting a behavioral health	
22	<pre>consultation; and</pre>	
23	(iii) providing behavioral health support	
24	to all children who are provided care; and	
25	(B) a description of the impact autism and other	
26	intellectual and developmental disabilities have on behavior and	
27	communication.	

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- 1 (a-2) The annual training described by Subsection (a)(2)
- 2 <u>must include training on care provided to children with special</u>
- 3 needs and methods for:
- 4 (1) identifying possible developmental delays;
- 5 (2) locating community resources for the children;
- 6 (3) providing effective communication to the
- 7 children's parents; and
- 8 (4) accommodating the special needs of children in the
- 9 classroom.
- 10 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 11 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 12 Services Commission shall adopt the rules necessary to implement
- 13 the changes in law made by this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
