## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

_	AN ACT	

- 2 relating to a study regarding available beds at inpatient mental
- 3 health facilities providing acute psychiatric treatment.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "commission" means the
- 6 Health and Human Services Commission.
- 7 (b) The commission shall conduct a study regarding the
- 8 availability of beds at inpatient mental health facilities in this
- 9 state that provide acute inpatient psychiatric treatment. The
- 10 study must evaluate:
- 11 (1) the current number of psychiatric beds available
- 12 at inpatient mental health facilities in this state that provide
- 13 inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals experiencing an
- 14 acute mental health crisis, including a breakdown of beds available
- 15 for patients:
- 16 (A) committed to a facility for competency
- 17 restoration services under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 18 (B) civilly committed to a facility under Chapter
- 19 841, Health and Safety Code;
- 20 (C) committed to a facility after having been
- 21 found not guilty by reason of insanity under Chapter 46C, Code of
- 22 Criminal Procedure;
- 23 (D) voluntarily admitted to a facility;
- 24 (E) 18 years of age or older;

- 1 (F) younger than 18 years of age; and
- 2 (G) receiving long-term mental health treatment
- 3 in a facility;
- 4 (2) the current number of patients admitted to an
- 5 inpatient mental health facility in this state that provides
- 6 inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals experiencing an
- 7 acute mental health crisis, including a breakdown of:
- 8 (A) the number of patients committed to a
- 9 facility for competency restoration services under Chapter 46B,
- 10 Code of Criminal Procedure, including the number of individuals
- 11 committed under an initial order of commitment or an order
- 12 extending the initial restoration period;
- 13 (B) the number of patients civilly committed to a
- 14 facility under Chapter 841, Health and Safety Code;
- 15 (C) the number of patients committed to a
- 16 facility after having been found not guilty by reason of insanity
- 17 under Chapter 46C, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 18 (D) the number of patients voluntarily admitted
- 19 to a facility;
- (E) the number of patients 18 years of age or
- 21 older;
- 22 (F) the number of patients younger than 18 years
- 23 of age;
- 24 (G) the percentage of patients in this state who
- 25 will likely require long-term mental health treatment in a
- 26 facility; and
- 27 (H) the number of patients who have been

- 1 diagnosed with an intellectual or developmental disability;
- 2 (3) the projected need over the next several years for
- 3 additional psychiatric beds at inpatient mental health facilities
- 4 that provide inpatient psychiatric treatment to individuals
- 5 experiencing an acute mental health crisis, including the projected
- 6 percentage of incoming patients who will likely require long-term
- 7 mental health treatment in a facility; and
- 8 (4) current and anticipated resources, including
- 9 workforce needs, necessary to meet the demands described by
- 10 Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this subsection.
- 11 (c) In designing and conducting the study, the commission
- 12 may collaborate with institutions of higher education in this state
- 13 that award medical degrees.
- 14 (d) Not later than September 1, 2024, the commission shall
- 15 prepare and submit to the legislature a written report containing
- 16 the results of the study and any recommendations for legislative or
- 17 other action.
- 18 SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2025.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
