S.B. No. 2591

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the appointment of the Department of Family and
- 3 Protective Services and a child's parent or legal guardian as joint
- 4 managing conservators for the child.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 262.352, Family Code, is amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 Sec. 262.352. JOINT MANAGING CONSERVATORSHIP OF CHILD. (a)
- 9 In this section, "hotel" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 10 792.001, Health and Safety Code.
- 11 (b) Before the department files a suit affecting the
- 12 parent-child relationship requesting managing conservatorship of a
- 13 child who suffers from a severe emotional disturbance in order to
- 14 obtain mental health services for the child, the department must,
- 15 unless it is not in the best interest of the child, discuss with the
- 16 child's parent or legal guardian the option of seeking a court order
- 17 for joint managing conservatorship of the child with the
- 18 department.
- 19 <u>(c) A court shall enter an order appointing the department</u>
- 20 and the child's parent or legal guardian as joint managing
- 21 conservators of the child if the court finds sufficient evidence to
- 22 satisfy a person of ordinary prudence and caution that the child's
- 23 parent or legal guardian has:
- 24 (1) exhausted all reasonable means available to the

- 1 parent or legal guardian to obtain mental health services to meet
- 2 the child's needs; and
- 3 (2) agreed to actively participate in the child's
- 4 service plan in preparation for the child's return to the parent or
- 5 legal guardian.
- 6 (d) A child in the joint managing conservatorship of the
- 7 <u>department and the child's parent or legal guardian may not receive</u>
- 8 temporary emergency care under Section 264.107(g) in a hotel or
- 9 other unlicensed setting.
- 10 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 11 to a suit affecting the parent-child relationship filed on or after
- 12 the effective date of this Act. A suit affecting the parent-child
- 13 relationship filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 14 governed by the law in effect on the date the suit was filed, and the
- 15 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
