1 SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, The City of Dallas unveiled signs with Korean
- 3 translations in the Royal Lane and Harry Hines Boulevard
- 4 neighborhood on January 13, 2023, providing well-deserved
- 5 recognition for the area popularly known as Koreatown; and
- 6 WHEREAS, January 13 is annually celebrated as Korean American
- 7 Day to commemorate the arrival of the first Korean immigrants to the
- 8 United States on January 13, 1903; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Greater Dallas Korean American Chamber of
- 10 Commerce, established in 1976, has been a crucial advocate for the
- 11 Korean American community in Dallas; and
- WHEREAS, About 40 years ago, Korean Texans living in the
- 13 Royal Lane and Harry Hines Boulevard neighborhood started to build
- 14 businesses, and the Korean commercial district was formed; since
- 15 then, the area has been transformed into a vibrant Korean wholesale
- 16 and retail center; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Royal Lane is a showcase of Korean culture, and a
- 18 prosperous Koreatown will be a continuing source of pride for those
- 19 who live and work in the area and for all Texans; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The designation of Koreatown by the Texas
- 21 Legislature provides well-deserved recognition for one of the
- 22 largest Korean American communities in the southern United States
- 23 and acknowledges the important contributions of the Korean
- 24 community, not only to the City of Dallas but to the entire State of

- 1 Texas; now, therefore, be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the 88th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 3 hereby designate the area from the intersection of Royal Lane and
- 4 Harry Hines Boulevard to the intersection of Royal Lane and Luna
- 5 Road in Dallas as Koreatown Dallas; and, be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of Section
- 7 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in effect
- 8 until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is finally
- 9 passed by the legislature.
