notable figures as Governor Greg Abbott, former governor and U.S. 14

energy secretary Rick Perry, former president George W. Bush, and 15

16 Senator Ted Cruz; the organization works to develop the next

contemporary problems among today's decision-makers; serving as a 18

catalyst for the exchange of diverse expertise and opinions, it 19

hosts conferences and other programs that further productive 20

21 discussions; in addition, it conducts the nationally recognized
