WHEREAS, Born in Beaumont and raised in Vidor, Mr. Walker has reached multiplatinum status with four albums, producing such hit songs as "What's It To You" and "She Won't Be Lonely Long" over the course of his nearly 30-year career; in 2021, he released his most recent album, *Texas to Tennessee*, featuring the single "Catching Up With An Ol' Memory"; and
