WHEREAS, Residents of Presidio County lost an admired civic leader with the passing of Felipe Cordero on January 1, 2023, at the age of 79; and

WHEREAS, Born in Redford, Phil Cordero entered the workforce at the age of 14, with only a sixth-grade education; he earned his master plumber's license and ran his own business until his health began to fail; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Cordero was deeply committed to his community and served in many capacities; for 33 years, he was a Presidio County commissioner, and he played a key role in such projects as the courthouse restoration, development of the MAC Building, and street paving in Presidio and Salsipuedes; he also championed the county's needs and advocated for domestic and international trade at the state and national level; as president of the chamber of commerce, he worked tirelessly to expand business opportunities; he was instrumental in the construction of the grandstand and dance floor for Marfa Lights and of the scoreboard and soccer fields for the Vizcaino Field; in addition, he was active in the Paisano Lions Club and AMVETS, and he gave generously of his time and expertise to the Marfa Independent School District, fixing plumbing, supporting school events, and officiating and commentating baseball games; moreover, he sponsored summer youth softball and baseball leagues, and he assisted the Mercedes Cemetery Association in numerous cleanup efforts and in the building of the chapel; and
