## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Established in 1974, the University 4 of 5 Houston-Downtown has built a reputation as an inclusive, equitable, and welcoming campus; with an accessible location at the heart of 6 7 downtown Houston, it serves a student body highly representative of the vibrant community; many of the more than 14,000 Texans enrolled 8 9 are transfer students or older adults returning to complete 10 degrees; and

11 WHEREAS, *The Wall Street Journal* has named UHD the most 12 diverse school in the South; seventy percent of freshmen are 13 first-generation college students, and the university is federally 14 designated as a Hispanic-Serving Institution, a Minority-Serving 15 Institution, and a Military-Friendly School; and

Led by its seventh president, Dr. Loren 16 WHEREAS, J. Blanchard, UHD offers 57 undergraduate and graduate degrees, with 17 19 opportunities for online degree completion; two of the programs 18 are ranked among the nation's best by U.S. News & World Report; the 19 institution is acknowledged under the Carnegie Classification 20 21 system as a comprehensive, regional university and has four colleges, Humanities and Social Sciences, Public Service, Sciences 22 23 and Technology, and the Marilyn Davies College of Business, which houses the largest MBA program in the area; over the years, UHD has 24
