March; during her tenure, she led all enforcement operations along

11 Mexico, managing 11 stations, 6 permanent immigrant checkpoints,

12 and 3 forward operating bases; she worked diligently to increase

13 transparency and improve engagement with the El Paso community,

14 earning plaudits from local immigrant advocates; and

WHEREAS, Chief Chavez grew up in Brownsville and graduated 15 magna cum laude from Columbia Southern University with a bachelor's 16 degree in criminal justice administration; after working for the 17 Nueces County Sheriff's Office and Taft Police Department, she 18 joined the Border Patrol in 1995 as an agent in Imperial Beach, 19 California; she went on to become chief of Washington State's 20 21 Spokane Sector and California's El Centro Sector; in addition, she served at national headquarters as deputy chief for operations 22 23 under the Law Enforcement Operations Directorate and as commander 24 for the CBP Migration Crisis Team; a recipient of the OHS

- 1 Secretary's Silver Medal Award, she holds a master's degree in
- 2 security studies-homeland security and defense from the Naval
- 3 Postgraduate School, and she is a graduate of the Senior Executive
- 4 Fellows Program at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government;
