WHEREAS, Mayor Mendez has been a dedicated and forward-thinking public servant for the past four years, leading his city into an era of new opportunities and greater inclusion; it is truly fitting that he receive special recognition as he moves on from his role as Brownsville's mayor; now, therefore, be it
