## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Blackwell School Alliance secured designation

of the Blackwell School in Marfa as a National Historic Site in

WHEREAS, Opened in 1909, in an era of de facto segregation of

5 Mexican Americans, the school served local students until 1965, a

6 year after passage of the Civil Rights Act, when Marfa integrated

7 its schools; the faculty was largely White, and children could be

8 punished harshly for speaking Spanish, even though for some, it was

9 not only their native language, but their only language; the school

10 was supplied with hand-me-down books and other equipment from Marfa

11 Elementary, the school for Whites; and

12 WHEREAS, Alumni of Blackwell School learned in 2006 that the

13 school district planned to tear down or sell the nearly century-old

one-room adobe schoolhouse; they began organizing to save the

15 structure, forming the Blackwell School Alliance in 2007; joined by

16 other community advocates, they cleaned up the building and

17 fundraised to make repairs; they went on to seek recognition for the

18 school from the Texas Historical Commission, which was granted in

19 2010; nine years later, their efforts led to its inclusion in the

20 National Register of Historic Places; and

21 WHEREAS, The members of the alliance have worked tirelessly

22 to document and preserve the school's history, partnering with

23 universities, state agencies, private foundations, the City of

24 Marfa, and individuals; in addition, they have garnered support

from elected officials, and in 2021, a bipartisan group of 1 representatives filed the Blackwell School National Historic Site 2 Act; it easily passed both chambers of Congress, and President Joe 3 Biden signed it into law on October 17, 2022, authorizing the 4 5 designation of the site as a unit of the National Park Service; and 6 WHEREAS, Today, the Blackwell School is one of the very few 7 National Historic Sites devoted specifically to the commemoration 8 of Latino heritage; the original school building functions as a museum and community center, with a replica classroom featuring 9 10 rows of old desks; moreover, the Blackwell School Alliance has assembled a wealth of artifacts, from trophies, sports uniforms, 11 12 photographs, and old letters to the wooden paddle once used to discipline children; the site also includes the 1927 Band Hall; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Through their hard work and many years of grassroots 15 advocacy, the members of the Blackwell School Alliance have ensured lasting protection of an authentic setting to commemorate and 16 17 interpret the Mexican American experience, the culture of the borderlands, and the sometimes painful history of progress in our 18 society; now, therefore, be it 19 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 88th Texas Legislature 20 hereby recognize April 22, 2023, as Blackwell School Day at the 21 State Capitol and commend the Blackwell School Alliance for its 22

outstanding contributions.
