8 rebuilt on the north bank of Williamson Creek, and that structure

9 was moved to East 13th Street in 1948 after the congregation

10 relocated to Austin; drawing more and more members, the church

11 moved into a larger sanctuary in 1979, and the old church building

12 was subsequently converted into the S. A. Davis Fellowship Hall;

13 over the years, the church has continued to expand its facilities to

14 accommodate the needs of its growing membership; and

WHEREAS, Since its founding, Mt. Zion Baptist Church has benefited from the dedicated efforts of many outstanding clergy,

17 including the Reverend Dr. Daryl L. Horton, who has led the
