RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The observance of World War II Veterans Capitol Day

2 on May 11, 2023, provides an opportunity to honor brave members of

3 the Greatest Generation for their selfless service; and

WHEREAS, In December 1941, the United States was drawn into

the most devastating and consequential conflict in human history;

6 then-Texas Governor Coke R. Stevenson predicted that Texans would

7 rise proudly to the challenge of defending their country, and he was

8 proved correct by the long lines of men waiting eagerly to enlist at

9 recruiting centers around the state; and

10 WHEREAS, Although Texas in that era had but five percent of

11 the nation's population, it provided seven percent of armed forces

12 personnel; Texas A&M University produced more officers than both of

13 the extant military academies together; by the end of the war,

14 750,000 Texans, including 12,000 women, had contributed to victory

15 over enemy forces; the majority of these service members were in the

16 U.S. Army and the Army Air Force, but nearly a quarter served in

17 other branches; over 22,000 Texans made the ultimate sacrifice, a

18 third of this number in the navy, marines, or coast guard; and

19 WHEREAS, Individual Texans fought with great valor in all the

20 theaters of the war, and 33 were awarded the Medal of Honor; one

21 such honoree, Lieutenant Audie L. Murphy of Farmersville, was the

22 most highly decorated American of the Second World War; more than

23 150 generals and 12 admirals were either natives or residents of

24 Texas, among them the supreme Allied commander in Europe, General

- 1 Dwight D. Eisenhower, a Denison native who was stationed at Fort Sam
- 2 Houston when the war began; Chester W. Nimitz, appointed commander
- 3 of the Pacific Fleet following the attack on Pearl Harbor, was born
- 4 in Fredericksburg and descended from a pioneer Texas German family;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, According to the National World War II Museum, as of
- 7 2022, 8,200 World War II veterans were living in Texas, the
- 8 fifth-highest number of all states in the U.S.; they represent 0.6
- 9 percent of the state's total veteran population of approximately
- 10 1,400,000; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Inspired by a deep sense of patriotism and love for
- 12 democracy, the veterans of World War II answered their nation's
- 13 call to duty, and it is indeed fitting to express our enduring
- 14 respect and admiration for their courage and immeasurable
- 15 fortitude; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 88th Texas Legislature
- 17 hereby recognize May 11, 2023, as World War II Veterans Capitol Day
- 18 and encourage all residents of the Lone Star State to learn more
- 19 about the incomparable contributions of the Greatest Generation.
