RESOLUTION

- BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of Texas, 88th
- 2 Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, That Senate Rule 12.03 be
- 3 suspended in part as provided by Senate Rule 12.08 to enable the
- 4 conference committee appointed to resolve the differences on House
- 5 Bill 4227 (provisions governing the municipal civil service of fire
- 6 fighters or police officers in certain municipalities) to consider
- 7 and take action on the following matter:
- 8 Senate Rule 12.03(4) is suspended to permit the committee to
- 9 add text on a matter not included in either the house or senate
- 10 version of the bill by adding the following new SECTIONS to the
- 11 bill:
- 12 SECTION 1. Section 143.003, Local Government Code, is
- amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (1) "Civilian oversight board" means a board or office
- 16 established by a municipality to practice oversight, monitoring, or
- 17 investigations of fire fighters or police officers, or departments,
- 18 by members of the public who are not fire fighters or police
- 19 officers.
- 20 (1-a) "Commission" means the Fire Fighters' and Police
- 21 Officers' Civil Service Commission.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 143, Local Government
- 23 Code, is amended by adding Section 143.017 to read as follows:
- Sec. 143.017. INVESTIGATION BY CIVILIAN OVERSIGHT BOARD

- 1 PROHIBITED. An investigation under this chapter may not be
- 2 performed by a civilian oversight board.
- 3 SECTION 4. Sections 143.089(b) and (f), Local Government
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) A letter, memorandum, or document relating to alleged
- 6 misconduct by the fire fighter or police officer:
- 7 (1) may not be placed in the person's personnel file if
- 8 the employing department determines that there is insufficient
- 9 evidence to sustain the charge of misconduct; and
- 10 (2) except as provided by Section 1701.451,
- 11 Occupations Code, may not be released to any agency or person
- 12 requesting the letter, memorandum, or document if there is a
- 13 pending investigation into the alleged misconduct.
- 14 (f) The director or the director's designee may not release
- 15 any information contained in a fire fighter's or police officer's
- 16 personnel file without first obtaining the person's written
- 17 permission, unless the release of the information is required by
- 18 law or for a law enforcement purpose.
- 19 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 143, Local Government
- 20 Code, is amended by adding Sections 143.091 and 143.092 to read as
- 21 follows:
- Sec. 143.091. MUTUAL AGREEMENT SUPERSEDES CERTAIN
- 23 MUNICIPAL LAW. For a municipality with a collective bargaining
- 24 agreement or a meet-and-confer agreement with the municipality's
- 25 fire department or police department, the agreement supersedes an
- 26 ordinance, executive order, or rule adopted by the municipality.
- Sec. 143.092. ELIGIBILITY FOR CIVILIAN OVERSIGHT BOARD. A

- 1 person is not eligible to serve on a civilian oversight board if the
- 2 person has been:
- 3 (1) convicted of or placed on deferred adjudication
- 4 community supervision for a felony offense; or
- 5 (2) convicted of a crime of moral turpitude.
- 6 SECTION 6. Section 143.306, Local Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 8 (d) A municipal charter, ordinance, executive order, or
- 9 rule adopted by a municipality that restricts or conditions the
- 10 authority of a public employer to enter into a written agreement
- 11 under this subchapter is void and unenforceable.
- 12 SECTION 7. Section 143.091, Local Government Code, as added
- 13 by this Act, applies to a collective bargaining agreement or a
- 14 meet-and-confer agreement that was in effect on or after January 1,
- 15 2023.
- 16 Explanation: The changes are necessary to make certain
- 17 changes to law relating to municipal civil service systems for fire
- 18 fighters and police officers in certain municipalities.
