## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Fentanyl Victims Remembrance Day is taking place on
- 2 September 23, 2023; and
- 3 WHEREAS, A highly addictive synthetic opioid, fentanyl has
- 4 fueled an alarming increase in overdose deaths, and it has impacted
- 5 communities across the nation, from large metropolitan areas to
- 6 rural counties; among Americans under the age of 50, the drug is
- 7 involved in a greater number of deaths than any other cause, proving
- 8 more lethal than cancer, heart disease, homicide, or suicide; as
- 9 little as two milligrams of fentanyl is a potentially deadly dose,
- 10 especially for individuals who do not have a tolerance to opioids;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 13 Prevention, synthetic opioids such as fentanyl were involved in
- 14 67 percent of the more than 107,000 drug overdose and drug
- 15 poisoning deaths in the 12-month period ending in January 2022; in
- 16 some cases, the deaths were attributed to fentanyl mixed with other
- 17 substances, and many users were unaware that they were taking
- 18 fentanyl; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Each year, September 23 is set aside to honor and
- 20 remember all victims who tragically lost their lives to fentanyl
- 21 poisoning, to encourage support for their loved ones, and to warn
- 22 the public about the dangers posed by the drug; the observance is
- 23 led by fentanyl awareness organizations, community response teams,
- 24 and affected families; and

- 1 WHEREAS, More work remains to be done to assist the
- 2 individuals and communities impacted by fentanyl use, and Fentanyl
- 3 Victims Remembrance Day provides a fitting opportunity to affirm
- 4 our commitment to combatting this deadly drug threat; now,
- 5 therefore, be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 88th Texas Legislature
- 7 hereby recognize September 23, 2023, as Fentanyl Victims
- 8 Remembrance Day and pay tribute to the memory of all those who have
- 9 died from fentanyl poisoning.
