5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 395, Local Government
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 395.0231 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 395.0231. CONSERVATION AND REUSE CREDITS AGAINST WATER
9	AND WASTEWATER FEES. (a) A political subdivision shall provide a
10	credit against water and wastewater impact fees otherwise assessed
11	to a development to a builder or developer for the construction,
12	contribution, or dedication of an eligible facility, system, or
13	product that results in water reuse, conservation, or savings.
14	(b) A facility, system, or product eligible for a credit
15	under this section includes a facility, system, or product that:
16	(1) reduces per service unit water consumption, supply
17	requirements, or necessary treatment and distribution
18	infrastructure per service unit;
19	(2) decreases the need of wastewater collection and
20	treatment facilities per service unit;
21	(3) diminishes the demand for stormwater and drainage
22	facilities per service unit; or

- 2 (c) A political subdivision that provides a credit under
