A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to a prohibition of the application of biosolids to
- 3 certain land.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 361.121, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 361.121. [LAND] APPLICATION TO NON-AGRICULTURAL LAND
- 8 OF CERTAIN SLUDGE; PERMIT REQUIRED.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 361.121(a)(2), Health and Safety Code,
- 10 is amended to read as follows:
- 11 (2) "Land application unit" means an area where wastes
- 12 are applied onto or incorporated into the soil surface for
- 13 <u>non-agricultural</u> [agricultural] purposes, including [or for]
- 14 treatment and disposal or maintaining public parks, golf courses,
- 15 and athletic fields. The term does not include manure spreading
- 16 operations.
- SECTION 3. Section 361.121(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (d) In each permit, the commission shall prescribe the
- 20 conditions under which it is issued, including:
- 21 (1) the duration of the permit;
- 22 (2) the location of the land application unit;
- 23 (3) the maximum quantity of Class B sludge that may be
- 24 applied or disposed of under the permit;

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- 1 (4) a requirement that the permit holder submit
- 2 quarterly to the commission a computer-generated report that
- 3 includes, at a minimum, information regarding:
- 4 (A) the source, quality, and quantity of sludge
- 5 applied to the land application unit;
- 6 (B) the location of the land application unit,
- 7 either in terms of longitude and latitude or by physical address,
- 8 including the county;
- 9 (C) the date of delivery of Class B sludge;
- 10 (D) the date of application of Class B sludge;
- 11 and
- 12 (E) the cumulative amount of metals applied to
- 13 the land application unit through the application of Class B
- 14 sludge;
- 15 [(F) crops grown at the land application unit
- 16 site; and
- 17 [(C) the suggested agronomic application rate
- 18 for the Class B sludge;
- 19 (5) a requirement that the permit holder submit
- 20 annually to the commission evidence that the permit holder is
- 21 complying with the nutrient management plan and the practice
- 22 standards described by Subsection (h)(4);
- 23 (6) a requirement that the permit holder post a sign
- 24 that is visible from a road or sidewalk that is adjacent to the
- 25 premises on which the land application unit is located stating that
- 26 a beneficial application site is located on the premises;
- 27 (7) any other monitoring and reporting requirements

- 1 prescribed by the commission for the permit holder; and
- 2 (8) a requirement that the permit holder must report
- 3 to the commission any noncompliance by the permit holder with the
- 4 permit conditions or applicable commission rules.
- 5 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 361, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 361.1211 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 361.1211. APPLICATION TO AGRICULTURAL LAND OF
- 8 BIOSOLIDS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES.
- 9 (a) This section applies only to a county with a population of not
- 10 less than 170,000 and not more than 190,000, according to the most
- 11 recent federal decennial census.
- 12 (b) In this section:
- 13 (1) "Agricultural land" means land that is used for:
- 14 (A) the production of plants or food grown for
- 15 <u>human or animal consumption;</u>
- 16 <u>(B)</u> animal grazing; or
- 17 (C) raising livestock.
- 18 (2) "Biosolids" means any solid, semi-solid, or liquid
- 19 material generated from the treatment of sewage sludge, including
- 20 Class A biosolids, Class AB biosolids, and Class B sludge.
- 21 (3) "Class A biosolids" means biosolids that meet the
- 22 metal limits established in 30 T.A.C. 312.43(b)(1) and (3) and the
- 23 pathogen reduction requirements of 30 T.A.C. 312.82(a)(1)(B).
- 24 (4) "Class AB biosolids" means biosolids that meet the
- 25 metal limits established in 30 T.A.C. 312.43(b)(1) and (3) and the
- 26 pathogen reduction requirements of 30 T.A.C. 312.82(a)(1)(A).
- 27 (5) "Class B sludge" means sewage sludge that meets

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- one of the pathogen reduction requirements of 30 T.A.C. 312.82(b).
- 2 (c) A person may not apply biosolids onto agricultural land
- 3 or incorporate biosolids into the soil of agricultural land in a
- 4 county to which this section applies.
- 5 SECTION 5. A permit, registration, or other authorization
- 6 issued by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality that allows
- 7 the application to agricultural land of biosolids, as defined by
- 8 Section 361.1211, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act,
- 9 expires on the effective date of this Act. The remainder of a
- 10 permit, registration, or other authorization that contains items in
- 11 addition to an authorization allowing the application to
- 12 agricultural land of biosolids remains in effect to the extent that
- 13 it does not authorize the application to agricultural land of
- 14 biosolids.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 16 last day of the legislative session.
