## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study by the Department of Public Safety on emergency
- 3 alert notification systems in this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "department" means the
- 6 Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas.
- 7 SECTION 2. STUDY ON EMERGENCY ALERT NOTIFICATION SYSTEMS.
- 8 The department, in coordination with the Department of State Health
- 9 Services, the Texas Division of Emergency Management, the Texas
- 10 Commission on Environmental Quality, and the Texas Department of
- 11 Transportation, shall conduct a study on the efficacy of emergency
- 12 alert notification systems in this state, including the alert
- 13 notification systems established under Subchapters K-1, L, L-1, M,
- 14 P, and Q, Chapter 411, Government Code, and any other alert
- 15 notification systems operated by the Texas Division of Emergency
- 16 Management. In conducting the study, the department shall:
- 17 (1) analyze the means by which emergency alerts are
- 18 communicated to the public, including roadside dynamic message
- 19 signs and phone alerts;
- 20 (2) analyze the appropriateness of the geographic
- 21 regions to which emergency alerts are broadcast, including whether
- 22 the size of those geographic regions should be increased or
- 23 decreased;
- 24 (3) consider whether there are too many emergency

- 1 alert notification systems in use and the extent to which members of
- 2 the public have deactivated emergency alert notifications on their
- 3 cell phones; and
- 4 (4) determine, as applicable, the percentage of
- 5 instances in which the activation of an emergency alert
- 6 notification system successfully resolved an emergency after the
- 7 alert was issued and the time it took from the issuance of the alert
- 8 to the successful resolution.
- 9 SECTION 3. REPORT AND LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS. Not
- 10 later than September 1, 2026, the department shall prepare and
- 11 submit a written report summarizing the results of the study to the
- 12 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 13 representatives, and each standing committee of the legislature
- 14 with jurisdiction over an emergency alert notification system. The
- 15 report must include recommendations for legislation to address the
- 16 findings of the study.
- SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 18 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect on the
- 19 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
