A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the state guard professionalization task force.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 437, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 437.311 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 437.311. STATE GUARD PROFESSIONALIZATION TASK FORCE.
7	(a) The State Guard Professionalization Task Force is a temporary
8	task force created to advise the adjutant general on the
9	professionalization of the Texas State Guard under the Texas
10	Military Department.
11	(b) The task force is composed of:
12	(1) the adjutant general or the adjutant general's
13	designee;
14	(2) the director of the Texas Department of Public
15	Safety or the director of the Texas Department of Public Safety's
16	designee;
17	(3) the director of the Texas Division of Emergency
18	Management or the director of the Texas Division of Emergency
19	Management's designee;
20	(4) the director of the Texas Department of
21	Transportation or the director of the Texas Department of
22	Transportation's designee;
23	(5) the director of the Texas A&M Forrest Service or

the director of the Texas A&M Forrest Service's designee; and

- 1 (6) any other directors or director's designees of any
- 2 other state agencies as determined by the adjutant general or the
- 3 adjutant general's designee.
- 4 (c) The adjutant general or the adjutant general's designee
- 5 is the chair of the task force.
- 6 (d) The task force shall meet as often as necessary to
- 7 perform the task force's duties. Meetings may be held at any time at
- 8 the request of the chair.
- 9 (e) The task force shall:
- 10 (1) use statistical analyses, data received from focus
- 11 groups on operations conducted by Texas State Guard, and other
- 12 research methods to conduct an examination of state missions and
- 13 operations of the State Guard in this state that includes:
- 14 (A) an identification of critical state missions
- 15 and operations needs; and
- 16 (B) a determination of the state's long-range
- 17 state missions and operations needs;
- 18 (2) identify and anticipate challenges and threats to
- 19 the state's operations, including but not limited to critical
- 20 infrastructure;
- 21 (3) develop solutions to overcome the challenges and
- 22 threats described by Subdivision (2);
- 23 (4) develop a strategy to professionalize and develop
- 24 capabilities of the Texas State Guard that is consistent with the
- 25 findings and determinations made under this subsection;
- 26 (5) recommend to the adjutant general and the
- 27 governor:

- 1 (A) strategies to solve the challenges
- 2 identified under Subdivision (1)(A);
- 3 (B) policy priorities to address the long-range
- 4 needs determined under Subdivision (1)(B);
- 5 (C) policy priorities and budgetary needs to
- 6 implement the strategies and solutions determined under
- 7 <u>Subdivision (3); and</u>
- 8 (6) advise the adjutant general and the governor
- 9 regarding the staffing, facilities, equipment, and technology
- 10 needed to implement the strategy determined under Subdivision (4).
- 11 (f) Not later than August 31, 2026, the task force shall
- 12 submit to adjutant general and the governor a report that contains
- 13 the recommendations described by Subsection (e)(6).
- 14 (g) This section expires September 1, 2026.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
