## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the Texas Jobs, Energy, Technology, and Innovation Act.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 403.602, Government Code, as added by
- 5 Chapter 377 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 6 Session, 2023, is amended by adding Subdivision (14-a) to read as
- 7 follows:

- 8 (14-a) "Priority project" means an eligible project for
- 9 which an applicant agrees to make an investment in an amount of at
- 10 least \$750 million by the end of the first tax year of the incentive
- 11 period prescribed by the agreement pertaining to the project.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 403.604(a), Government Code, as added by
- 13 Chapter 377 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 14 Session, 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) A jobs requirement prescribed by this section does not
- 16 apply to an eligible project that is:
- 17 <u>(1)</u> an electric generation facility described by
- 18 Section 403.602(8)(A)(i)(b); or
- 19 <u>(2) a priority project</u>.
- SECTION 3. Section 403.607, Government Code, as added by
- 21 Chapter 377 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 22 Session, 2023, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 23 follows:
- 24 (a-1) The comptroller shall notify a school district when an

- 1 application applicable to the school district is received.
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 403.609(b), Government Code, as added by
- 3 Chapter 377 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 4 Session, 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) The comptroller may not recommend an application for
- 6 approval unless the comptroller finds that:
- 7 (1) the proposed project that is the subject of the
- 8 application is an eligible project;
- 9 (2) the proposed project is reasonably likely to
- 10 generate, before the 20th anniversary of the first day of the
- 11 construction period, state or local tax revenue, including ad
- 12 valorem tax revenue attributable to the effect of the project on the
- 13 economy of this state, in an amount sufficient to offset the school
- 14 district maintenance and operations ad valorem tax revenue lost as
- 15 a result of the agreement;
- 16 (3) for a proposed project other than an electric
- 17 generation facility described by Section 403.602(8)(A)(i)(b), the
- 18 agreement is a compelling factor in a competitive site selection
- 19 determination and that, in the absence of the agreement, the
- 20 applicant would not make the proposed investment in this state; and
- 21 (4) if the application indicates that the eligible
- 22 project is proposed to be located in a qualified opportunity zone,
- 23 the project is located in the zone.
- SECTION 5. Section 403.612(b), Government Code, as added by
- 25 Chapter 377 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 26 Session, 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 27 (b) An agreement entered into under this section between the

- 3 (1) specify the project to which the agreement
- 4 applies;
- 5 (2) specify the term of the agreement, which must:
- 6 (A) begin on the date the agreement is entered

- 8 (B) end on December 31 of the third tax year
- 9 following the end of the incentive period;
- 10 (3) specify the construction and incentive periods for
- 11 the project;
- 12 (4) specify the manner for determining the taxable
- 13 value for school district maintenance and operations ad valorem tax
- 14 purposes during the incentive period under Section 403.605 for the
- 15 eligible property subject to the agreement;
- 16 (5) specify the applicable jobs and investment
- 17 requirements prescribed by Section 403.604 and require the
- 18 applicant to comply with those requirements;
- 19 (6) require that the average annual wage paid to all
- 20 persons employed by the applicant <u>in required jobs</u> in connection
- 21 with the project be not less than [used to calculate total jobs
- 22 exceed] 110 percent of the county average annual wage for
- 23 manufacturing [all] jobs in the county where the project is located
- 24 [applicable industry sector] during the most recent four quarters
- 25 for which data is available, as computed by the Texas Workforce
- 26 Commission, with the applicant's average annual wage being equal to

- 7 (7) require the applicant to pay a penalty prescribed
- 8 by Section 403.614 if the applicant fails to comply with an
- 9 applicable jobs or wage requirement;
- 10 (8) require the applicant to offer and contribute to a
- 11 group health benefit plan for each employee of the applicant who is
- 12 employed in a full-time job;
- 13 (9) require the applicant, at the time the applicant
- 14 executes the agreement, to execute a performance bond in an amount
- 15 the comptroller determines to be reasonable and necessary to
- 16 protect the interests of the state and the district and conditioned
- 17 on the applicant's compliance with the terms of the agreement;
- 18 (10) authorize the governor or the district to
- 19 terminate the agreement as provided by Subsection (d); and
- 20 (11) incorporate each relevant provision of this
- 21 subchapter.
- 22 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act to Subchapter
- 23 T, Chapter 403, Government Code, as added by Chapter 377 (H.B. 5),
- 24 Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, apply only to
- 25 an agreement entered into under that subchapter pursuant to an
- 26 application submitted under that subchapter on or after the
- 27 effective date of this Act. An agreement entered into under that

- 1 subchapter pursuant to an application submitted before the
- 2 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 3 date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued
- 4 in effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
