## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study by the Legislative Budget Board concerning the
- 3 long-term effects of regulating tuition rates and amounts charged
- 4 by public institutions of higher education.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 322, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Section 322.0166 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 322.0166. STUDY CONCERNING REGULATION OF TUITION. (a)
- 9 In this section, "institution of higher education" has the meaning
- 10 assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 11 (b) The board shall conduct a study to examine the long-term
- 12 costs, benefits, and other effects of any legislative action that
- 13 may be taken to regulate the rates and amounts of tuition charged by
- 14 institutions of higher education, including by repealing the
- 15 statutory authority of those institutions to establish tuition
- 16 rates as they determine appropriate. The study may explore all
- 17 topics relevant to the matter, but in assessing the effects of
- 18 regulation, the study must strive to strike a balance between
- 19 promoting the affordability and accessibility of higher education
- 20 <u>in this state and the institutions' need for sufficient revenue to</u>
- 21 maintain educational quality for students and competitiveness with
- 22 other institutions outside this state. In the study, the board
- 23 <u>shall</u>:
- 24 (1) recommend to the legislature an appropriate rate

- 1 or rates of tuition for institutions of higher education compared
- 2 to the rates currently established by the institutions;
- 3 (2) evaluate the potential effects of regulating
- 4 tuition rates and amounts on student access to higher education
- 5 opportunities in this state, including the effect on enrollment by
- 6 disadvantaged or underrepresented Texans, and the potential
- 7 <u>effects on affordability, student financial aid, and student loan</u>
- 8 debt;
- 9 (3) estimate the potential loss or gain of funding or
- 10 revenue by the institutions as a result of any repeal of the
- 11 existing statutory authority of those institutions to establish
- 12 tuition rates; and
- 13 (4) if the board projects that regulating tuition
- 14 rates and amounts would result in a loss of revenue under
- 15 Subdivision (3):
- (A) identify any sources of funding or revenue,
- 17 such as institutional endowments, that would be available or
- 18 necessary to offset the projected decrease in revenue; and
- 19 (B) recommend a specific portion or amount of
- 20 endowment money that could be used to offset the reduced tuition
- 21 <u>revenues.</u>
- (c) Not later than December 1, 2026, the board shall submit
- 23 to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house
- 24 of representatives, and the presiding officer of each standing
- 25 legislative committee having jurisdiction over higher education or
- 26 state appropriations a report on the results of the study and the
- 27 board's recommendations for legislative or other action.

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- 1 (d) This section expires September 1, 2027.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
