2	Sec. 434.452. CERTAIN PERSONS CONSIDERED HONORABLY
3	DISCHARGED. (a) The State of Texas recognizes a person as having
4	been honorably discharged from active military service if:
5	(1) according to the person's military discharge
6	record, the person on the basis of the person's sexual orientation:
7	(A) was dishonorably discharged; or
8	(B) resigned, retired, or otherwise separated
9	from active military service; and
10	(2) based on any previous characterization of service,
11	the person would have otherwise received a more favorable character
12	of discharge.
13	(b) For purposes of Subsection (a)(1), a person is
14	considered to have been dishonorably discharged or to have
15	resigned, retired, or otherwise separated from active military
16	service on the basis of the person's sexual orientation if:
17	(1) any of the following separation codes appear on
