## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	public	school	policies	regarding	student	use	of

3 personal electronic devices.

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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 38.028 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 38.028. RESTRICTIONS ON STUDENT USE OF PERSONAL
- 8 ELECTRONIC DEVICES. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Lockable container" means a reusable secure case,
- 10 pouch, or bag that has a locking mechanism and can be used to
- 11 <u>securely store a personal electronic device.</u>
- 12 (2) "Personal electronic device" means a device
- 13 carried on the person that is capable of displaying, delivering,
- 14 producing, or otherwise providing access in a digital format to
- 15 text, audio, images, or videos. The term does not apply to a device
- 16 issued for educational purposes by a school district.
- 17 (b) The board of trustees of a school district shall adopt a
- 18 written policy prohibiting students from using a personal
- 19 <u>electronic device during the school day.</u>
- 20 <u>(c) A policy adopted under this section must:</u>
- 21 (1) require each student to place immediately on
- 22 arriving at a district campus during regular school hours, or
- 23 before the beginning of the regular school day if the student
- 24 arrives at a district campus before regular school hours, each of

- 1 the student's personal electronic devices in a secure location or
- 2 storage device, such as a lockable container, provided by the
- 3 district that:
- 4 (A) prevents the student from viewing or using
- 5 the device during the regular school day; and
- 6 (B) is made accessible for the student to
- 7 retrieve the device at the end of the school day;
- 8 (2) include enforcement provisions to ensure strict
- 9 compliance with the policy by students and district employees;
- 10 (3) provide that a student may contact the student's
- 11 parent or caregiver during the school day if needed by using a
- 12 telephone made available to the student in a manner and location
- 13 designated by the district; and
- 14 (4) authorize a student to access a personal
- 15 electronic device during the school day if a medical professional
- 16 provides written documentation indicating that the student's
- 17 access to the device is necessary to manage or treat a medical
- 18 condition diagnosed by the professional.
- 19 (d) The commissioner shall adopt rules to implement this
- 20 section, including rules to ensure the collection by the agency and
- 21 uniform reporting by school districts to the agency of data
- 22 regarding the effectiveness of policies adopted under this section.
- (e) The agency annually until 2030 shall post a report on
- 24 the agency's Internet website regarding the data collected under
- 25 Subsection (d). The report must contain data that measures:
- 26 (1) the effects of policies adopted under this section
- 27 on student behavior, mental health, and disciplinary incidents; and

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- 1 (2) opinions of students and district employees
- 2 <u>regarding the policies.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 4 school year.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
