A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to accommodating voters with a disability; creating
- 3 criminal offenses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 64.009, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (f), (g), and (h) and by adding Subsections
- 7 (a-3), (b-1), (i) and (j) to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 64.009. VOTER UNABLE TO ENTER POLLING PLACE. (a) If a
- 9 voter is physically unable to enter the polling place without
- 10 personal assistance or likelihood of injuring the voter's health,
- 11 on the voter's request, an election officer shall deliver a ballot
- 12 to the voter at the polling place entrance or curb.
- 13 (a-1) At each polling place an area for parking not smaller
- 14 than the size of one parking space shall be reserved for voting
- 15 under this section. The area may not be designated specifically for
- 16 persons with disabilities. The area must be clearly marked with a
- 17 sign:
- 18 (1) indicating that the space is reserved for use by a
- 19 voter who is unable to enter the polling place; and
- 20 (2) displaying, in large font that is clearly readable
- 21 from a vehicle, a telephone number that a voter may call or text to
- 22 request assistance from an election officer at the polling place.
- 23 (a-2) As an alternative to displaying a telephone number
- 24 under Subsection (a-1)(2), a parking space may comply with the

- 1 requirements of this section by providing the voter with a button or
- 2 intercom that the voter may use to request assistance from an
- 3 election officer.
- 4 (a-3) Except as provided by Subchapter B, an election
- 5 officer who delivers a ballot to the voter at the polling place
- 6 entrance or curb may not provide assistance in marking the ballot.
- 7 (b) The regular voting procedures, except those in
- 8 Subchapter B, may be modified by the election officer to the extent
- 9 necessary to conduct voting under this section.
- 10 (b-1) Prior to delivering a ballot to the voter making the
- 11 request under Subsection (a), the voter shall take the following
- 12 oath and sign a form acknowledging the oath: "I affirm under penalty
- 13 of perjury that I am requesting to vote curbside and that I am
- 14 physically unable to enter the polling place without personal
- 15 <u>assistance or likelihood of injuring my health."</u>
- 16 (c) After the voter is accepted for voting, the voter shall
- 17 mark the ballot and give it to the election officer who shall
- 18 deposit it in the ballot box.
- 19 (d) On the voter's request, a person accompanying the voter
- 20 shall be permitted to select the voter's ballot and deposit the
- 21 ballot in the ballot box.
- (e) Except as provided by Section 33.057, a poll watcher is
- 23 entitled to observe any activity conducted under this section.
- 24 (f) A person who, during the early voting period and on
- 25 election day, [simultaneously] assists seven or more voters voting
- 26 under this section by providing the voters with transportation to
- 27 polling place must complete and sign a form, provided by an election

- 1 officer, that contains the person's name and address and whether
- 2 the person is providing assistance solely under this section or
- 3 under both this section and Subchapter B.
- 4 (f-1) Subsection (f) does not apply if the person is related
- 5 to each voter within the second degree by affinity or the third
- 6 degree by consanguinity, as determined under Subchapter B, Chapter
- 7 573, Government Code.
- 8 (g) A form completed under Subsections (b-1) and (f) shall
- 9 be delivered to the secretary of state as soon as practicable. The
- 10 secretary shall retain a form delivered under this section for the
- 11 period for preserving the precinct election records and shall make
- 12 the form available to the attorney general for inspection upon
- 13 request.
- 14 (h) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form \underline{s}
- 15 described by Subsections (b-1) and (f).
- 16 (i) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 17 fails to complete the form required by Subsections (b-1) and (f).
- (j) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 64.0322(a), Election Code, is amended by
- 20 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c), (d), and (e) to
- 21 read as follows:
- Sec. 64.0322. SUBMISSION OF FORM BY ASSISTANT. (a) A
- 23 person $[\tau]$ other than an election officer, who assists a voter in
- 24 accordance with this chapter is required to complete a form
- 25 stating:
- 26 (1) the name and address of the person assisting the
- 27 voter;

- 1 (2) the relationship to the voter of the person
- 2 assisting the voter; [and]
- 3 (3) whether the person assisting the voter received or
- 4 accepted any form of compensation or other benefit from a
- 5 candidate, campaign, or political committee; and
- 6 (4) whether the person assisted seven or more voters
- 7 voting under this subchapter during the early voting period and on
- 8 election day.
- 9 (b) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form required
- 10 by this section. The form must be incorporated into the official
- 11 carrier envelope if the voter is voting an early voting ballot by
- 12 mail and receives assistance under Section 86.010, or must be
- 13 submitted to an election officer at the time the voter casts a
- 14 ballot if the voter is voting at a polling place or under Section
- 15 64.009.
- 16 (c) A form completed under Subsection (a) shall be delivered
- 17 to the secretary of state as soon as practicable. The secretary of
- 18 state shall retain a form delivered under this section for the
- 19 period for preserving the precinct election records and shall make
- 20 the form available to the attorney general for the inspection upon
- 21 <u>request.</u>
- 22 <u>(d) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly</u>
- 23 fails to complete the form required by this section.
- (e) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 25 SECTION 3. Section 64.036, Election Code, is amended by
- 26 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 27 follows:

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- 1 Sec. 64.036. UNLAWFUL ASSISTANCE. (a) A person commits an
- 2 offense if the person knowingly:
- 3 (1) provides assistance to a voter who is not eligible
- 4 for assistance;
- 5 (2) while assisting a voter prepares the voter's
- 6 ballot in a way other than the way the voter directs or without
- 7 direction from the voter;
- 8 (3) while assisting a voter suggests by word, sign, or
- 9 gesture how the voter should vote; or
- 10 (4) provides assistance to a voter who has not
- 11 requested assistance or selected the person to assist the voter.
- 12 (b) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 13 assists a voter in violation of Section 64.032(c).
- 14 (c) An election officer commits an offense if the officer
- 15 knowingly permits a person to provide assistance:
- 16 (1) to a voter who is not eligible for assistance; or
- 17 (2) in violation of Section 64.032(c).
- 18 (d) An election officer commits an offense if the officer
- 19 knowingly provides assistance to a voter in violation of Sections
- 20 64.032(a) or 64.032(b).
- 21 <u>(e)</u> [(d)] An offense under this section is a Class A
- 22 misdemeanor.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
