## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the operation of a motor vehicle passing a pedestrian or
3	a person operating a bicycle in certain municipalities; creating a
4	criminal offense.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 545.0571 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 545.0571. MOTOR VEHICLE PASSING PEDESTRIAN OR BICYCLE
9	OPERATOR. (a) This section applies only to a person operating a
10	motor vehicle within the boundaries of a municipality with a
11	population of 100,000 or more.
12	(b) An operator of a motor vehicle shall exercise due care
13	to avoid colliding with a pedestrian or a person operating a bicycle
14	on a highway or street.
15	(c) For the purposes of Section 545.053(a), safe distance
16	from a pedestrian or any part of a bicycle is:

- 16
- 17 (1) at least three feet if the operator's vehicle is a
- passenger car or a light truck; or 18
- 19 (2) at least six feet if the operator's vehicle is a
- commercial motor vehicle as defined by Section 522.003 or a truck 20
- 21 other than a light truck.
- (d) For the purposes of Section 545.057(a), conditions 22
- 23 permit safely passing a pedestrian or a bicycle to the right only if
- 24 the motor vehicle passes:

- 1 (1) at least three feet from the pedestrian or any part
- 2 of the bicycle if the operator's vehicle is a passenger car or a
- 3 light truck; or
- 4 (2) at least six feet from the pedestrian or any part
- 5 of the bicycle if the operator's vehicle is a commercial motor
- 6 vehicle as defined by Section 522.003 or a truck other than a light
- 7 truck.
- 8 <u>(e) An operator of a motor vehicle passing a pedestrian or a</u>
- 9 person operating a bicycle on a highway or street that has two or
- 10 more marked lanes running in the same direction shall move the motor
- 11 vehicle to a lane other than the lane used by the pedestrian or
- 12 bicycle operator while passing the pedestrian or bicycle operator.
- (f) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this
- 14 section that at the time of the offense the pedestrian or bicycle
- 15 operator was acting in violation of a traffic law in a manner that
- 16 contributed to the offense under this section.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 545.055, Transportation Code, is amended
- 18 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), an [An] operator
- 21 may not drive on the left side of the roadway in a no-passing zone or
- 22 on the left side of any pavement striping designed to mark a
- 23 no-passing zone.
- 24 (b-1) Subsection (b) [This subsection] does not prohibit a
- 25 driver from:
- 26 (1) crossing pavement striping, or the center line in
- 27 a no-passing zone marked by signs only, to make a left turn into or

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- 1 out of an alley or private road or driveway; or
- 2 (2) passing a pedestrian or a person operating a
- 3 bicycle in a no-passing zone if the operator of the motor vehicle
- 4 otherwise complies with the requirements of this chapter.
- 5 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 6 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 7 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 8 by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the
- 9 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 10 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 11 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
