## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of community-based learning centers
3	to serve public school students.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 33.912 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 33.912. COMMUNITY-BASED LEARNING CENTERS. (a) In
8	this section, "center" means a community-based learning center
9	established under Subsection (b).
10	(b) The agency shall establish, in collaboration with
11	faith-based nonprofit organizations, a program for the development
12	and operation of community-based learning centers in various school
13	districts to provide students who qualify for compensatory
14	education, as determined by the commissioner, with access to:
15	(1) technology;
16	(2) tutoring services;
17	(3) mentoring services;
18	(4) social and emotional support;
19	(5) outdoor activities;
20	<u>(6) art;</u>
21	(7) sports; and
22	(8) individually designed services and supports that
23	may include treatment services, personal support services, or any
24	other support necessary to improve academic and social outcomes for

- 1 a student, as determined by a center.
- 2 (c) The agency shall adopt minimum training and skills
- 3 requirements that each individual providing services through the
- 4 center must satisfy.
- 5 (d) From money appropriated for the purpose, the agency
- 6 shall pay the costs for developing and operating a center. The
- 7 agency shall actively seek federal grants or money to pay costs
- 8 associated with the establishment and operation of each center.
- 9 (e) The agency by rule shall establish a procedure for
- 10 distributing money to a school district or other appropriate entity
- 11 approved by the agency to establish and operate or contract for the
- 12 operation of a center.
- (f) In addition to money appropriated by the legislature,
- 14 the agency may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source
- 15 for establishing the program.
- 16 (g) The agency may adopt rules as necessary to implement
- 17 this section, including rules regarding an application process and
- 18 eligibility criteria to develop and operate a center.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
