SECTION 3. Section 25.0811(a), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by this section, a school district
 may not begin instruction for students for a school year before the
 <u>first</u> [fourth] Monday in <u>September</u> [August]. A school district may:

(1) begin instruction for students for a school year
before the <u>first</u> [fourth] Monday in <u>September</u> [August] if the
district operates a year-round system under Section 25.084; or

(2) begin instruction for students for a school year
on or after the <u>third</u> [first] Monday in August at a campus or at not
more than 20 percent of the campuses in the district if:

3 (B) the district at the beginning of the school 4 year provides, financed with local funds, days of instruction for 5 students at the campus or at each of the multiple campuses, in 6 addition to the minimum <u>instructional time</u> [number of days of 7 <u>instruction</u>] required under Section 25.081;

8 (C) the campus or each of the multiple campuses 9 <u>is</u> [are] undergoing comprehensive reform, as determined by the 10 board of trustees of the district; and

(D) a majority of the students at the campus or at
each of the multiple campuses are educationally disadvantaged.

SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this section, this Act applies beginning with the 2026-2027 school year.

16 (b) Sections 12A.003 and 12A.004, Education Code, as 17 amended by this Act, apply only to a local innovation plan adopted or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. 18 A local innovation plan adopted or renewed before the effective date of 19 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the plan was 20 adopted or renewed, and the former law is continued in effect for 21 that purpose. 22

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
