3	certifications issued in other states; authorizing a fee.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 2, Occupations Code, is amended by adding
6	Chapter 61 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 61. RECOGNITION OF OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES AND GOVERNMENT
8	<u>CERTIFICATIONS</u>
9	Sec. 61.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Board" means a department, commission, board,
11	office, or other agency of this state or a political subdivision of
12	this state that issues an occupational license or government
13	certification to an individual.
14	(2) "Government certification" means a voluntary,
15	government-granted, and nontransferable recognition to ar
16	individual who meets personal qualifications related to a lawful
17	occupation and may be used as part of a professional title in
18	addition to any professional title associated with an occupational
19	license. The term does not include an occupational license,
20	certificate, or other credential, including a license or
21	certification issued by a state licensing authority as a
22	prerequisite to working lawfully in an occupation.

(3) "Lawful occupation" means a course of conduct,

- 1 or services that are not illegal to sell or provide irrespective of
- 2 whether the individual selling or providing the goods or services
- 3 is subject to an occupational license.
- 4 (4) "Military" means the armed forces of the United
- 5 States, including the air force, army, coast guard, marine corps,
- 6 navy, space force, national guard, and all reserve components and
- 7 <u>auxiliaries</u>. The term includes the militia of any United States
- 8 territory or state.
- 9 (5) "Occupational license" means a nontransferable
- 10 <u>authorization</u> for an individual to perform a lawful occupation
- 11 based on meeting personal qualifications, including a military
- 12 occupational specialty. In an occupation for which an occupational
- 13 license is required, it is illegal for an individual who does not
- 14 possess a valid occupational license to perform the occupation.
- 15 (6) "Other state" or "another state" means any
- 16 <u>territory or state in the United States other than this state and</u>
- 17 includes a branch or unit of the military.
- 18 (7) "Scope of practice" means the procedures, actions,
- 19 processes, and work that an individual is authorized to perform
- 20 under an occupational license or government certification issued in
- 21 this state.
- Sec. 61.002. RECOGNITION OF OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE OR
- 23 GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATION. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a
- 24 board shall issue an occupational license or government
- 25 certification to an individual who applies in a manner prescribed
- 26 by the board if the individual:
- 27 (1) holds a current and valid occupational license or

- 1 government certification in another state in a lawful occupation
- 2 with a similar scope of practice, as determined by the board;
- 3 (2) has held the occupational license or government
- 4 certification in another state for at least one year;
- 5 (3) was required by a board in another state to pass an
- 6 <u>examination</u> or to meet education, training, or experience
- 7 standards;
- 8 (4) is in good standing with the board in the other
- 9 state;
- 10 (5) does not have a disqualifying criminal record as
- 11 determined by the board in this state;
- 12 (6) has not had an occupational license or government
- 13 certification revoked by the board of another state due to
- 14 negligence or intentional misconduct related to the individual's
- 15 work in the occupation;
- 16 (7) did not surrender an occupational license or
- 17 government certification in another state due to negligence or
- 18 intentional misconduct related to the individual's work in the
- 19 occupation;
- 20 (8) does not have a complaint, allegation, or
- 21 investigation pending before a board in another state that relates
- 22 <u>to unprofessional conduct or an alleged crime; and</u>
- 23 (9) pays all applicable fees in this state.
- 24 (b) If another state issued the individual a government
- 25 certification without requiring an occupational license but an
- 26 occupational license is required in this state, a board shall issue
- 27 an occupational license to the individual if the individual

- 1 otherwise satisfies Subsection (a).
- 2 (c) A board may not make a final determination on an
- 3 individual's application for an occupational license or government
- 4 certification if the individual is the subject of a complaint,
- 5 allegation, or pending investigation until the complaint,
- 6 allegation, or investigation is resolved or the individual
- 7 otherwise meets the criteria for an occupational license or
- 8 government certification in this state to the satisfaction of the
- 9 board.
- 10 Sec. 61.003. RECOGNITION OF WORK EXPERIENCE.
- 11 Notwithstanding any other law, a board shall issue an occupational
- 12 license or government certification to an individual who applies
- 13 for an occupational license or government certification based on
- 14 work experience in another state, if the individual:
- 15 (1) worked in a state that does not require an
- 16 occupational license or government certification to engage in a
- 17 lawful occupation but an occupational license or government
- 18 certification is required in this state to engage in a lawful
- 19 occupation with a similar scope of practice, as determined by the
- 20 board;
- 21 (2) worked for at least three years in the lawful
- 22 <u>occupation; and</u>
- 23 (3) satisfies Sections 61.002(a)(5)-(9).
- Sec. 61.004. STATE LAW EXAMINATION. A board may require an
- 25 individual to pass a jurisprudential examination specific to
- 26 relevant state laws that regulate the occupation if an occupational
- 27 license or government certification in this state requires an

- 1 individual to pass a jurisprudential examination as a prerequisite
- 2 to receiving an occupational license or government certification.
- 3 Sec. 61.005. DECISION. Except as provided by Section
- 4 61.002(c), a board shall provide a written decision to an
- 5 individual regarding the individual's application for an
- 6 occupational license or government certification not later than the
- 7 30th day after the date of receiving a complete application.
- 8 Sec. 61.006. APPEAL. (a) An individual may appeal a
- 9 board's decision to the appropriate court.
- 10 (b) An individual may appeal:
- 11 (1) a denial of an occupational license or government
- 12 certification;
- 13 (2) a determination of the occupation;
- 14 (3) a determination of the similarity of the scope of
- 15 practice of the occupational license or government certification
- 16 issued; or
- 17 (4) any other decision made by a board under this
- 18 chapter.
- 19 Sec. 61.007. STATE LAWS AND JURISDICTION. An individual
- 20 who obtains an occupational license or government certification
- 21 under this chapter is subject to:
- 22 (1) the laws regulating the occupation in this state;
- 23 and
- 24 (2) the jurisdiction of the board that regulates the
- 25 occupation in this state.
- Sec. 61.008. EXCEPTION. This chapter does not apply to an
- 27 occupation regulated by the supreme court.

- 1 Sec. 61.009. LIMITATIONS. This chapter may not be
- 2 construed to:
- 3 (1) prohibit an individual from applying for or being
- 4 issued an occupational license or government certification under
- 5 another state law or rule;
- 6 (2) prevent this state from:
- 7 (A) entering into a licensing compact or
- 8 reciprocity agreement with another state, foreign province, or
- 9 foreign country; or
- 10 (B) recognizing occupational credentials issued
- 11 by a private certification organization, foreign province, foreign
- 12 country, international organization, or other entity; or
- 13 (3) require a private certification organization to
- 14 grant or deny private certification to an individual.
- Sec. 61.010. FEE. A board may charge a fee to an individual
- 16 not to exceed \$100 for each application to cover the costs of
- 17 administering this chapter.
- Sec. 61.011. PREEMPTION. This chapter preempts the law of a
- 19 municipality, county, or other political subdivision in this state
- 20 that regulates occupational licenses and government certification.
- Sec. 61.012. EMERGENCY POWERS. (a) During a declared state
- 22 of disaster, the governor may order the recognition of an
- 23 occupational license from another state or foreign country as if
- 24 the license is issued in this state without an individual meeting
- 25 the requirements of this chapter.
- 26 (b) The governor may expand the scope of practice for an
- 27 occupational license and may authorize any license holder to

- 1 provide services in this state in person, by telephone, or by other
- 2 means for the duration of the disaster.
- 3 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 4 of this Act, a licensing authority that regulates an occupational
- 5 license or government certification in this state shall adopt rules
- 6 to implement Chapter 61, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
