5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Title 6, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 129C to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 129C. AGREEMENTS PROHIBITING DISCLOSURES REGARDING CHILD
9	SEXUAL ABUSE
10	Sec. 129C.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Act of sexual abuse" means conduct described by
12	one or more of the following penal laws:
13	(A) indecency with a child under Section 21.11,
14	Penal Code;
15	(B) sexual assault under Section 22.011, Penal
16	Code;
17	(C) aggravated sexual assault under Section
18	22.021, Penal Code;
19	(D) sexual performance by a child under Section
20	43.25, Penal Code;
21	(E) trafficking of persons under Section
22	20A.02(a)(3), (4), (7), or (8), Penal Code; and
23	(F) compelling prostitution under Section 43.05,
24	Penal Code.

- 1 (2) "Child" means a person younger than 17 years of
- 2 age.
- 3 Sec. 129C.002. CERTAIN PROVISIONS UNENFORCEABLE. Any
- 4 provision of a nondisclosure or confidentiality agreement,
- 5 employment agreement, settlement agreement, or any other agreement
- 6 <u>is void and unenforceable as against the public policy of this state</u>
- 7 to the extent the provision:
- 8 <u>(1) prohibits a party from notifying, or limits the</u>
- 9 party's ability to notify, a local or state law enforcement agency
- 10 or any state or federal regulatory agency of an act of sexual abuse
- 11 committed against a child; or
- 12 (2) prohibits a party from disclosing to any person,
- 13 including during any related investigation, prosecution, legal
- 14 proceeding, or dispute resolution, facts surrounding any act of
- 15 sexual abuse committed against a child, including the identity of
- 16 the alleged offender.
- 17 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to an
- 18 agreement entered into before, on, or after the effective date of
- 19 this Act.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
