- 2 relating to a temporary teaching certificate for certain military

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 21.0444(b) and (c), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) This section applies to a person seeking <u>teaching</u>
- 8 certification [to teach career and technology education] who:
- 9 (1) has served in the armed forces of the United States
- 10 and was honorably discharged, retired, or released from active
- 11 duty; or
- 12 (2) has served as a first responder and, while in good
- 13 standing and not because of pending or final disciplinary actions
- 14 or a documented performance problem, retired, resigned, or
- 15 separated from employment as a first responder.
- 16 (c) The board shall propose rules under this subchapter
- 17 providing for the issuance of a temporary <u>teaching</u> certificate [to
- 18 teach career and technology education] to a person described by
- 19 Subsection (b) who meets all other eligibility requirements for
- 20 standard teaching certification [to teach career and technology
- 21 education], except that the person may substitute for a requirement
- 22 that the person hold:
- 23 (1) an associate degree from an accredited institution
- 24 of higher education, 48 months of active duty military service or

- 1 service as a first responder; or
- 2 (2) a bachelor's degree:
- 3 (A) the military service or service as a first
- 4 responder described by Subdivision (1); and
- 5 (B) 60 semester credit hours completed at a
- 6 public or private institution of higher education with a minimum
- 7 grade point average of at least 2.50 on a four-point scale.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 21.458(a-2), Education Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (a-2) A school district shall assign a mentor teacher to a
- 11 classroom teacher who has been issued a temporary teaching
- 12 certificate [to teach career and technology education] under
- 13 Section 21.0444 for at least two school years.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
