A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to the Texas Medical Disclosure Panel.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 74.102, Civil Practice and Remedies

Code, is amended by amending Subsections (b), (c), (d), and (h) and

6 adding Subsections (f-1) and (i) to read as follows:

- 7 (b) The disclosure panel established herein is
- 8 administratively attached to the [Texas Department of] Health and
- 9 Human Services Commission. The commission [Texas Department of
- 10 Health], at the request of the disclosure panel, shall provide
- 11 administrative assistance to the panel; and the $\underline{\text{commission}}$ [$\underline{\text{Texas}}$
- 12 Department of Health] and the disclosure panel shall coordinate
- 13 administrative responsibilities in order to avoid unnecessary
- 14 duplication of facilities and services. The commission [Texas
- 15 Department of Health], at the request of the panel, shall submit the
- 16 panel's budget request to the legislature. The panel shall be
- 17 subject, except where inconsistent, to the rules and procedures of
- 18 the commission [Texas Department of Health]; however, the duties
- 19 and responsibilities of the panel as set forth in this chapter shall
- 20 be exercised solely by the disclosure panel, and the $\underline{\text{executive}}$
- 21 <u>commissioner of the commission</u> [board] or the commission [Texas
- 22 Department of Health] shall have no authority or responsibility
- 23 with respect to same.
- (c) The disclosure panel is composed of 13 [nine] members,

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- 1 with three members representing the public, at least one of whom has
- 2 <u>a background in health literacy</u>, three members licensed to practice
- 3 law in this state, at least one of whom has experience representing
- 4 patients and at least one of whom has experience representing
- 5 physicians or health care providers, and seven [six] members
- 6 licensed to practice medicine in this state. Members of the
- 7 disclosure panel shall be selected by the <u>executive</u> commissioner of
- 8 the Health and Human Services Commission [health].
- 9 (d) At the expiration of the term of each member of the
- 10 disclosure panel so appointed, the <u>executive</u> commissioner <u>of the</u>
- 11 <u>Health and Human Services Commission</u> shall select a successor, and
- 12 such successor shall serve for a term of six years, or until that
- 13 $\underline{\text{member's}}$ [his] successor is selected. Any member who is absent for
- 14 three consecutive meetings without the consent of a majority of the
- 15 disclosure panel present at each such meeting may be removed by the
- 16 <u>executive</u> commissioner at the request of the disclosure panel
- 17 submitted in writing and signed by the chairman. Upon the death,
- 18 resignation, or removal of any member, the executive commissioner
- 19 shall fill the vacancy by selection for the unexpired portion of the
- 20 term.
- 21 (f-1) The disclosure panel may not take any action requiring
- 22 <u>a vote of the panel unless a majority of the members appointed to</u>
- 23 serve on the panel as members licensed to practice medicine in this
- 24 state are in attendance at the meeting when the vote is taken.
- 25 (h) Employees of the [Texas Department of] Health <u>and Human</u>
- 26 Services Commission shall serve as the staff for the panel.
- (i) When appointing panel members representing the public,

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- 1 the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services
- 2 Commission may not appoint a registered lobbyist, a health care
- 3 provider or the spouse of a health care provider, or a person who
- 4 works in any health care-related field, including health insurance.
- 5 The executive commissioner shall give preference to persons with
- 6 experience in advocating for the public interest.
- 7 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 74.103, Civil Practice
- 8 and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 74.103. DUTIES OF DISCLOSURE PANEL; LIMITATIONS ON
- 10 AUTHORITY.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 74.103, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 12 Code, is amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 13 <u>(e) The panel is not authorized to take any action that</u>
- 14 changes the scope of practice authority of any physician or health
- 15 <u>care provider.</u>
- SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2026, the executive
- 17 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 18 appoint new members to the Texas Medical Disclosure Panel in
- 19 accordance with Section 74.102, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 20 as amended by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
