## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the use of interim testing and adaptive, growth-based assessment instruments for certain required assessments of public 3 school students and prohibiting the use of the results of certain 4 required assessments of public school students for certain 5 6 purposes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 8 SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 21, Education Code, is 9 amended by adding Section 21.417 to read as follows: Sec. 21.417. PROHIBITING USE OF CERTAIN ASSESSMENT 10 INSTRUMENTS AS SOLE CRITERION IN TEACHER EVALUATION 11 OR 12 COMPENSATION. The results of an assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a), (b), or (n) may not be used as the sole 13 14 criterion in evaluating teacher performance or determining teacher 15 compensation. 16 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 39.0264 to read as follows: 17 18 Sec. 39.0264. SCHOOL DISTRICT ADOPTION AND ADMINISTRATION 19 OF INTERIM TESTING AND ADAPTIVE, GROWTH-BASED ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS. (a) In this section, "adaptive, growth-based 20 assessment instrument" means an assessment instrument that: 21 22 (1) adjusts the level of difficulty for each student 23 during administration of the assessment instrument to match the knowledge and ability demonstrated by the student on the assessment 24

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1 instrument; and 2 (2) measures each student's academic progress over a 3 period of time, regardless of the student's age, grade level, or 4 performance in class. 5 (b) The commissioner shall apply to the United States Department of Education for a waiver of the requirement under the 6 7 Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) to 8 administer the same assessment instruments to all public school students. 9 10 (c) If the United States Department of Education grants a waiver described by Subsection (b), a school district may adopt or 11 12 develop assessment instruments in accordance with this section and administer those assessment instruments in lieu of the assessment 13 instruments required under Section 39.023(a), (b), or (n) in each 14 15 subject and at each grade level for which an assessment instrument is required to be administered under Section 39.023(a). 16 17 (d) Each assessment instrument administered under this section must be administered during the school year through 18 19 statewide interim assessments. The results of the interim assessments for each subject shall be combined to determine a 20 single summative score on that assessment instrument for each 21 22 student in the manner established by commissioner rule. (e) An assessment instrument administered under this 23 24 section in an electronic format must be an adaptive, growth-based 25 assessment instrument. 26 (f) In adopting or developing assessment instruments under

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this section, a school district may contract with a nonprofit

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1	organization that specializes in developing adaptive, growth-based
2	assessment instruments.
3	(g) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
4	implement this section, including rules:
5	(1) providing the number and timing of the
6	administration of the statewide interim assessments to be
7	administered to a student for each assessment instrument described
8	by Subsection (c), which must include at least:
9	(A) one interim assessment administered at the
10	beginning of the school year; and
11	(B) one interim assessment administered at the
12	end of the school year; and
13	(2) establishing the criteria necessary to ensure an
14	assessment instrument is an adaptive, growth-based assessment
15	instrument.
16	(h) A reference in law to an assessment instrument adopted
17	or developed under Section 39.023(a), (b), or (n) includes an
18	assessment instrument adopted or developed and administered by a
19	school district in accordance with a waiver described by Subsection
20	(b) and this section.
21	SECTION 3. Section 39.053, Education Code, is amended by
22	adding Subsection (c-4) to read as follows:
23	<pre>(c-4) For purposes of Subsection (c)(2)(A), a student's</pre>
24	improvement on an assessment instrument administered under Section
25	39.0264 must be measured from the beginning of the school year for
26	which the district or campus is being evaluated to the end of that
27	school year.

H.B. No. 1095 1 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2026-2027 2 school year.

3 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2026, the commissioner 4 of education shall apply to the United States Department of 5 Education for a waiver of the requirement under the Every Student 6 Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) to administer the same 7 assessment instruments to all public school students.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
