- 6 SECTION 1. Section 37.081, Education Code, is amended by
- adding Subsection (a-5) to read as follows: 7
- (a-5) An honorably retired peace officer, as defined by 8
- 9 Section 614.121, Government Code, employed as security personnel
- under Subsection (a) must: 10
- 11 (1) keep the peace officer's license in active status;
- 12 and
- 13 (2) fulfill all applicable requirements under
- 14 Sections 1701.351 and 1701.352, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 2. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended 15
- by adding Subdivision (19) to read as follows: 16
- (19) "School district honorably retired peace 17
- officer" means an honorably retired peace officer, as defined by 18
- Section 614.121, Government Code, who is employed by a school 19
- district. 20
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 1702.322, Occupations Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1702.322. LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL. This chapter 23
- 24 does not apply to:

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(1) a person who is a peace officer or a school 1 district honorably retired peace officer [has full-time employment 2 as a peace officer] and who receives compensation for private 3 employment on an individual or an independent contractor basis as a 4 5 patrolman, guard, extra job coordinator, or watchman if the 6 officer: (A) 7 is employed employee-employer in an 8 relationship or employed on an individual contractual basis: 9 (i) directly by the recipient of the 10 services; or (ii) by a company licensed under 11 this 12 chapter; in the employ of another 13 (B) is not 14 officer; 15 (C) [is not a reserve peace officer; and 16 [(D)] works [as a peace officer] on the average 17 of at least 32 hours a week for and $[\tau]$ is compensated [by the state]or a political subdivision of the state] at least at the minimum 18 19 wage by: (i) for a peace officer, the state or a 20 political subdivision of the state; or 21 22 (ii) for a school district honorably retired peace officer, a school district; and 23 24 is entitled to all employee benefits offered to a peace officer by the state or political subdivision described 25 26 by Paragraph (C); (2) a reserve peace officer while the reserve officer 27

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- 1 is performing guard, patrolman, or watchman duties for a county and
- 2 is being compensated solely by that county;
- 3 (3) a peace officer acting in an official capacity in
- 4 responding to a burglar alarm or detection device; or
- 5 (4) a person engaged in the business of electronic
- 6 monitoring of an individual as a condition of that individual's
- 7 community supervision, parole, mandatory supervision, or release
- 8 on bail, if the person does not perform any other service that
- 9 requires a license under this chapter.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
