A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study conducted by the Texas Department of Motor
- 3 Vehicles regarding parking for certain individuals with
- 4 disabilities.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "department" means the
- 7 Texas Department of Motor Vehicles.
- 8 SECTION 2. STUDY. (a) The department, with the assistance
- 9 of the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas, the
- 10 Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities, and the Texas
- 11 Demographic Center, shall conduct a study on the current and future
- 12 parking needs of individuals with disabilities in this state,
- 13 including disabled veterans and individuals with a mobility
- 14 impairment.
- 15 (b) In conducting the study, the department shall:
- 16 (1) compile data regarding the current and projected
- 17 population of individuals with disabilities in this state who may
- 18 be eligible for privileged parking under Chapter 681,
- 19 Transportation Code, including disabled veterans and individuals
- 20 with a mobility impairment;
- 21 (2) identify current laws and rules governing parking
- 22 spaces or areas designated for individuals with disabilities,
- 23 including the laws and rules governing the allocation of parking
- 24 for individuals with disabilities; and

- 1 (3) to the extent possible, collect information from
- 2 local law enforcement agencies regarding the number of citations
- 3 each agency has issued for a violation of Section 681.011(a) or (b),
- 4 Transportation Code.
- 5 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2026, the
- 6 department shall submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor,
- 7 the speaker of the house of representatives, and each member of the
- 8 legislature a written report that includes:
- 9 (1) a summary of the information compiled in the
- 10 study, including an analysis of the efficiency and effectiveness of
- 11 the current allocation of parking to individuals with disabilities;
- 12 and
- 13 (2) a summary of recommendations from the department,
- 14 the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas, the
- 15 Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities, and the Texas
- 16 Demographic Center, including:
- 17 (A) recommendations regarding the amount of
- 18 parking that should be allocated for individuals with disabilities
- 19 to meet the current and future demands of individuals with
- 20 disabilities in this state who may be eligible for privileged
- 21 parking under Chapter 681, Transportation Code, including disabled
- 22 veterans and individuals with a mobility impairment; and
- 23 (B) recommendations for legislative or other
- 24 action.
- 25 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 26 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 27 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas

- 1 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 2 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
