## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the Department of Family and Protective Services'
- 3 annual report of key performance measures and data elements for
- 4 child protection; authorizing a penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 264.001, Family Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subdivision (6) to read as follows:
- 8 (6) "Substitute care" has the meaning assigned by
- 9 Section 263.001.
- SECTION 2. Section 264.017, Family Code, is amended by
- 11 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (g) to read as
- 12 follows:

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- 13 (b) The department shall provide the report required by
- 14 Subsection (a) to the legislature and shall publish the report and
- 15 make the report available electronically to the public, including
- 16 by posting the report on the department's Internet website, not
- 17 later than February 1 of each year. The report must include, with
- 18 respect to the preceding year:
- 19 (1) information on the number and disposition of
- 20 reports of child abuse and neglect received by the department;
- 21 (2) information on the number of children [clients]
- 22 for whom the department took protective action, including
- 23 investigations, alternative responses, and court-ordered removals;
- 24 (3) information on the number of children [clients]

- 1 for whom the department provided services in each program
- 2 administered by the child protective services division, including
- 3 investigations, alternative responses, family-based safety
- 4 services, conservatorship, post-adoption services, and
- 5 transitional living services;
- 6 (4) the number of children in this state who died as a
- 7 result of child abuse or neglect;
- 8 (5) the number of children described by Subdivision
- 9 (4) for whom the department was the children's managing conservator
- 10 at the time of death;
- 11 (6) information on the timeliness of the department's
- 12 initial contact in an investigation or alternative response;
- 13 (7) information on the response time by the department
- 14 in commencing services to families and children for whom an
- 15 allegation of child abuse or neglect has been made;
- 16 (8) information regarding child protection staffing
- 17 and caseloads by program area;
- 18 (9) information on the permanency goals in place and
- 19 achieved for children in the managing conservatorship of the
- 20 department, including information on the timeliness of achieving
- 21 the goals, the stability of the children's placement in foster
- 22 care, and the proximity of placements to the children's home
- 23 counties;
- 24 (10) the number of children who suffer from a severe
- 25 emotional disturbance and for whom the department is appointed
- 26 managing conservator, including statistics on appointments as
- 27 joint managing conservator, due to an individual voluntarily

- 1 relinquishing custody of a child solely to obtain mental health
- 2 services for the child;
- 3 (11) the number of children who are pregnant or a
- 4 parent while in the managing conservatorship of the department and
- 5 the number of the children born to a parent in the managing
- 6 conservatorship of the department who are placed in the managing
- 7 conservatorship of the department;
- 8 (12) the number of children who are missing from the
- 9 children's substitute care provider while in the managing
- 10 conservatorship of the department; [and]
- 11 (13) of the children identified under Subdivision
- 12 (12):
- 13 (A) the number of children who were located and
- 14 returned to substitute care;
- 15 (B) the actions taken by the department to locate
- 16 those children; and
- 17 <u>(C)</u> the outcome of each child's case;
- 18 (14) the number of children who were victims of
- 19 trafficking under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, while in the managing
- 20 conservatorship of the department;
- 21 (15) of the children identified under Subdivision
- 22 <u>(14):</u>
- (A) the actions taken by the department to

- 26 (16) information on the program under Subchapter I,

10	(E) the number of relative or designated
11	caregivers who receive financial assistance; and
12	(F) outcome information for children placed with
13	a relative or designated caregiver including:
14	(i) how many months children spent with a
15	relative or designated caregiver before a case was closed;
16	(ii) the rates of types of resolutions for
17	closed cases; and
18	(iii) statistics comparing the outcomes for
19	relative or designated caregiver placements with and without
20	<pre>financial assistance;</pre>
21	(17) information on the number of substitute care
22	providers, other than relative or designated caregivers, who
23	received financial assistance;
24	(18) the number of complaints brought against
25	substitute care providers;
26	(19) the number of children in relative or designated
27	caregiver placements reunified with their families: and

- 1 (20) the number of children in substitute care, other
- 2 than relative or designated caregiver placements, reunified with
- 3 their families.
- 4 (g) The comptroller shall assess a penalty against the
- 5 department in the amount of \$1,000 for each day after February 1 the
- 6 department has not filed the report under Subsection (b). The
- 7 comptroller shall reallocate the amount assessed as a penalty under
- 8 this subsection as necessary to allow the department to use the
- 9 money to provide monetary assistance to relative and other
- 10 designated caregivers under Section 264.755.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
