8	Except as provided by Subsection (b), personal information
9	collected by the court, a party, or a party's attorney during the
10	jury selection process about a person who reports for jury duty is
11	confidential and may not be disclosed by the court, a party, a
12	party's attorney, or any court personnel. Information considered
13	<pre>confidential under this subsection includes:</pre>
14	(1) a person's:
15	(A) home address;
16	(B) telephone number;
17	(C) social security number; and
18	(D) driver's license number;
19	(2) information provided in the juror questionnaire
20	required by Section 62.0132; and
21	(3) any other personal information.
22	(b) The court may authorize the disclosure of information
23	described by Subsection (a) only on submission of an application to
24	the court showing good cause for the disclosure by:

- 1 (1) a party to the proceeding; or
- 2 (2) a person acting in the actual discharge of the
- 3 person's duties as a member of the news media.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to a person who reports for jury duty on or after the effective date
- 6 of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
