H.B. No. 1507

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to tuition and fee exemptions for firefighters enrolled in
certain courses at public institutions of higher education.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 54.353(a), Education Code, is amended to
read as follows:

(a) The governing board of an institution of higher
education shall exempt from the payment of tuition and laboratory
fees any student enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of
a fire science curriculum [~~who~~]:

(1) who is employed as a firefighter by a political
subdivision of this state; or

(2) who:

(A) is:

(i) a member in good standing of a volunteer
fire department that is registered with the Texas A&M Forest
Service and responds to 9-1-1 emergency calls in a designated area;
or

(ii) currently, and has been for at least
one year, an active member of an organized volunteer fire
department participating in the Texas Emergency Services
Retirement System or a retirement system established under the
Texas Local Fire Fighters Retirement Act (Article 6243e, Vernon's
Texas Civil Statutes);

1 (B) attends at least 20 hours of annual training
2 approved by the State Firefighters' and Fire Marshals' Association
3 of Texas;

4 (C) attends or provides support services for at
5 least 25 percent of the department's emergencies in a calendar
6 year; and

7 (D) [who] holds:

8 (i) [~~A~~] an Accredited Advanced level of
9 certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the
10 State Firefighters' [~~Firemen's~~] and Fire Marshals' Association of
11 Texas volunteer certification program; or

12 (ii) [~~B~~] Phase V (Firefighter II)
13 certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the
14 Texas Commission on Fire Protection's voluntary certification
15 program under Section 419.071, Government Code.

16 SECTION 2. Section 54.353(a), Education Code, as amended by
17 this Act, applies beginning with tuition and laboratory fees
18 charged for the 2025 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory fees
19 charged for an academic period before that semester are covered by
20 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act,
21 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
26 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
