- 5 ARTICLE 1. LIMITED-SCOPE REVIEWS
- 6 SECTION 1.01. TEXAS FUNERAL SERVICE COMMISSION. (a)
- 7 Notwithstanding Section 651.002, Occupations Code, the Sunset
- 8 Advisory Commission shall conduct a limited-scope review of the
- 9 Texas Funeral Service Commission for the 90th Legislature.
- 10 (b) In conducting the limited-scope review under this
- 11 section, the Sunset Advisory Commission staff evaluation and report
- 12 must be limited to assessing the Texas Funeral Service Commission's
- 13 administration of functions and duties regarding the regulation of
- 14 willed body programs, non-transplant anatomical donation
- 15 organizations, and anatomical facilities under Section 651.005,
- 16 Occupations Code, and under Chapters 691 and 692A, Health and
- 17 Safety Code.
- 18 (c) The Sunset Advisory Commission's recommendations to the
- 19 90th Legislature may include any recommendation the commission
- 20 considers appropriate based on the limited-scope review conducted
- 21 under this section.
- 22 (d) This section takes effect only if Senate Bill 2721 or
- 23 similar legislation of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,
- 24 relating to the licensing and regulation of persons who provide

- 2 legislation described by this subsection does become law, this

- 4 SECTION 1.02. STATE SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION BOARD.
- 5 Section 12, Chapter 358 (S.B. 1424), Acts of the 88th Legislature,
- 6 Regular Session, 2023, is repealed.
- 7 ARTICLE 2. ENTITIES GIVEN 2031 SUNSET DATE
- 8 SECTION 2.01. CREDIT UNION DEPARTMENT. Section 15.212,
- 9 Finance Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 15.212. SUNSET PROVISION. The Credit Union Department
- 11 and the Credit Union Commission are subject to Chapter 325,
- 12 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence
- 13 as provided by that chapter, the department and commission are
- 14 abolished September 1, 2031 [2035].
- 15 SECTION 2.02. STATE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS.
- 16 Section 2003.023, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 2003.023. SUNSET PROVISION. The State Office of
- 18 Administrative Hearings is subject to review under Chapter 325
- 19 (Texas Sunset Act), but is not abolished under that chapter. The
- 20 office shall be reviewed during the periods in which state agencies
- 21 abolished in 2031 [2027] and every 12th year after 2031 [2027] are
- 22 reviewed.
- 23 SECTION 2.03. TEXAS JUVENILE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT. (a)
- 24 Section 202.010, Human Resources Code, is amended to read as
- 25 follows:
- Sec. 202.010. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas Juvenile Justice
- 27 Board and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department are subject to

- 1 Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued
- 2 in existence as provided by that chapter, the board and the
- 3 department are abolished September 1, 2031 [2027].
- 4 (b) Notwithstanding Section 202.010, Human Resources Code,
- 5 as amended by this Act, the Sunset Advisory Commission shall
- 6 conduct a limited-scope review of the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 7 Department for the 90th Legislature.
- 8 (c) In conducting the limited-scope review under this
- 9 section, the Sunset Advisory Commission staff evaluation and report
- 10 must be limited to assessing the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 11 Department's administration of its regionalization duties aimed at
- 12 prioritizing the use of local levels of the juvenile justice system
- 13 over placement or commitment to secure facilities operated by the
- 14 Texas Juvenile Justice Department.
- 15 (d) The Sunset Advisory Commission may not review the office
- 16 of independent ombudsman of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department
- 17 as part of the limited-scope review conducted under this section.
- 18 (e) The Sunset Advisory Commission's recommendations to the
- 19 90th Legislature may include any recommendation the commission
- 20 considers appropriate based on the limited-scope review conducted
- 21 under this section.
- 22 (f) The Texas Juvenile Justice Department shall submit a
- 23 report not later than September 1, 2026, to the Sunset Advisory
- 24 Commission, the speaker of the house of representatives, the
- 25 lieutenant governor, and the standing committees of each house of
- 26 the legislature with primary jurisdiction over juvenile justice
- 27 that includes information about:

- 1 (1) the status of the United States Department of
- 2 Justice's investigation into the Texas Juvenile Justice Department
- 3 and the Texas Juvenile Justice Department's progress in addressing
- 4 findings as detailed in the United States Department of Justice's

- 7 (2) the waitlist of youth committed to the Texas
- 8 Juvenile Justice Department awaiting transfer to state secure
- 9 facilities from county facilities;
- 10 (3) the Texas Juvenile Justice Department's staffing
- 11 and turnover at state facilities for each fiscal year since fiscal
- 12 year 2016; and
- 13 (4) the progress on construction of additional state
- 14 juvenile correctional facilities for which the legislature
- 15 appropriated funding in the 2024-2025 biennium.
- ARTICLE 3. ENTITIES GIVEN 2033 SUNSET DATE
- 17 SECTION 3.01. STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINERS.
- 18 (a) Section 801.003, Occupations Code, is amended to read as
- 19 follows:
- Sec. 801.003. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The State Board of
- 21 Veterinary Medical Examiners is subject to Chapter 325, Government
- 22 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
- 23 by that chapter, the board is abolished September 1, 2033 [2027].
- 24 (b) This section takes effect only if S.B. 2155 or similar
- 25 legislation of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,
- 26 relating to the regulation of veterinary professionals and
- 27 facilities by the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners and

- 1 the temporary administration of the board by the Texas Department
- 2 of Licensing and Regulation becomes law. If legislation described
- 3 by this subsection does not become law, this section has no effect.
- 4 ARTICLE 4. ENTITIES GIVEN 2035 SUNSET DATE
- 5 SECTION 4.01. LOWER COLORADO RIVER AUTHORITY. Section
- 6 8503.0021(a), Special District Local Laws Code, is amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (a) The authority is subject to review under Chapter 325,
- 9 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act), but may not be abolished under
- 10 that chapter. The review shall not include the management of the
- 11 generation or transmission of electricity under the wholesale
- 12 electricity operation of the authority and the authority's
- 13 affiliated nonprofit corporations. The review shall be conducted
- 14 under Section 325.025, Government Code, as if the authority were a
- 15 state agency scheduled to be abolished September 1, 2035 [2031],
- 16 and every 12th year after that year.
- 17 ARTICLE 5. AMENDMENTS TO THE TEXAS SUNSET ACT
- 18 SECTION 5.01. SUNSET ADVISORY COMMISSION. Section
- 19 325.003(a-1), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a-1) A public member acts on behalf of the legislature when
- 21 participating on the commission in furtherance of the legislature's
- 22 duty to provide oversight of state [executive branch] agencies'
- 23 implementation of legislative priorities.
- 24 SECTION 5.02. AGENCY REPORT TO COMMISSION. Section
- 25 325.007(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) Before September 1 of the odd-numbered year before the
- 27 year in which a state agency subject to this chapter is abolished or

- 1 <u>reviewed</u>, the agency shall report to the commission:
- 2 (1) information regarding the application to the
- 3 agency of the criteria in Section 325.011; and
- 4 (2) any other information that the agency considers
- 5 appropriate or that is requested by the commission.
- 6 SECTION 5.03. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF AGENCY BEING
- 7 REVIEWED. Section 325.0075, Government Code, is amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 Sec. 325.0075. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF AGENCY BEING
- 10 REVIEWED. Before September 1 of the odd-numbered year before the
- 11 year in which a state agency subject to this chapter is abolished or
- 12 reviewed, the agency shall submit to the commission, the governor,
- 13 the lieutenant governor, and each member of the legislature a
- 14 report that:
- 15 (1) lists each report that the agency is required by a
- 16 statute to prepare; and
- 17 (2) evaluates the need for each report listed in
- 18 Subdivision (1) based on whether factors or conditions have changed
- 19 since the date the statutory requirement to prepare the report was
- 20 enacted.
- 21 SECTION 5.04. COMMISSION DUTIES. Section 325.008(a),
- 22 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) Before January 1 of the year in which a state agency
- 24 subject to this chapter and its advisory committees are abolished
- 25 <u>or reviewed</u>, the commission shall:
- 26 (1) review and take action necessary to verify the
- 27 reports submitted by the agency under Section 325.007;

- 1 (2) consult the Legislative Budget Board, the
- 2 Governor's Budget, Policy, and Planning Division, the State
- 3 Auditor, and the comptroller of public accounts, or their
- 4 successors, on the application to the agency of the criteria
- 5 provided in Section 325.011;
- 6 (3) conduct a review of the agency based on the
- 7 criteria provided in Section 325.011 and prepare a written report;
- 8 and
- 9 (4) review the implementation of commission
- 10 recommendations contained in the reports presented to the
- 11 legislature during the preceding legislative session and the
- 12 resulting legislation.
- SECTION 5.05. PUBLIC HEARINGS. Section 325.009(a),
- 14 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) Before February 1 of the year a state agency subject to
- 16 this chapter and its advisory committees are abolished or reviewed,
- 17 the commission shall conduct public hearings concerning but not
- 18 limited to the application to the agency of the criteria provided in
- 19 Section 325.011.
- 20 SECTION 5.06. REVIEW OF CERTAIN AGENCIES. Sections
- 21 325.0125(a) and (b), Government Code, are amended to read as
- 22 follows:
- 23 (a) In the two-year period preceding the date scheduled for
- 24 the abolition or review of a state agency under this chapter, the
- 25 commission may exempt certain agencies from the requirements of
- 26 this chapter relating to staff reports, hearings, and reviews.
- 27 (b) The commission may only exempt agencies that have been

- 1 inactive for a period of two years preceding the date the agency is
- 2 scheduled for abolition or review, that have been rendered inactive
- 3 by an action of the legislature, or that the commission determines
- 4 are unable to participate in the review due to a declared disaster.
- 5 ARTICLE 6. EFFECTIVE DATE
- 6 SECTION 6.01. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 7 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 8 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 9 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 10 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
