## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the eligibility of certain first responders for
- 3 workers' compensation benefits for post-traumatic stress disorder
- 4 under the workers' compensation system.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 408.006(b), Labor Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (b) Notwithstanding Section 408.0061 [504.019], a mental or
- 9 emotional injury that arises principally from a legitimate
- 10 personnel action, including a transfer, promotion, demotion, or
- 11 termination, is not a compensable injury under this subtitle.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 504.019, Labor Code, is transferred to
- 13 Subchapter A, Chapter 408, Labor Code, redesignated as Section
- 14 408.0061, and amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 408.0061 [504.019]. COVERAGE FOR POST-TRAUMATIC
- 16 STRESS DISORDER FOR CERTAIN FIRST RESPONDERS. (a) In this section:
- 17 (1) "First responder" means an individual employed by
- 18 this state, a political subdivision of this state, or an
- 19 institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003,
- 20 Education Code, who is:
- 21 (A) a peace officer under Article 2A.001, Code of
- 22 Criminal Procedure;
- 23 (B) an individual [a person] licensed under
- 24 Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code, as an emergency care

- 1 attendant, emergency medical technician, <u>advanced</u> emergency
- 2 medical <u>technician</u> [technician-intermediate], emergency medical
- 3 technician-paramedic, or licensed paramedic; or
- 4 (C) a firefighter subject to certification by the
- 5 Texas Commission on Fire Protection under Chapter 419, Government
- 6 Code, whose principal duties are firefighting and aircraft crash
- 7 and rescue.
- 8 (2) "Post-traumatic stress disorder" means a disorder
- 9 that meets the diagnostic criteria for post-traumatic stress
- 10 disorder specified by the American Psychiatric Association in the
- 11 Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fifth
- 12 edition, or a later edition adopted by the commissioner of workers'
- 13 compensation.
- 14 (b) Post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a first
- 15 responder is a compensable injury under this subtitle only if it is
- 16 based on a diagnosis that:
- 17 (1) the disorder is caused by one or more events
- 18 occurring in the course and scope of the first responder's
- 19 employment; and
- 20 (2) the preponderance of the evidence indicates that
- 21 the event or events were a producing cause of the disorder.
- (c) For purposes of this subtitle, the date of injury for
- 23 post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a first responder is the
- 24 date on which the first responder first knew or should have known
- 25 that the disorder may be related to the first responder's
- 26 employment.
- SECTION 3. Section 501.001(5-a), Labor Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (5-a) "Post-traumatic stress disorder" has the
- 3 meaning assigned by Section 408.0061 [504.019].
- 4 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a compensable
- 6 injury that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 7 claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before that date is
- 8 governed by the law as it existed on the date the compensable injury
- occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 10 purpose.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
