- $2\,$ relating to increasing the minimum term of imprisonment for the
- 3 offense of trafficking of persons.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 20A.02(b), Penal Code, as amended by
- 6 Chapters 93 (S.B. 1527) and 452 (H.B. 3554), Acts of the 88th
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, is reenacted and amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection and
- 10 Subsection (b-1), an offense under this section is a felony of the
- 11 second degree with a minimum term of imprisonment of 15 years. An
- 12 offense under this section is a felony of the first degree with a
- 13 minimum term of imprisonment of 15 years if:
- 14 (1) the applicable conduct constitutes an offense
- 15 under Subsection (a)(5), (6), (7), or (8), regardless of whether
- 16 the actor knows the age of the child or whether the actor knows the
- 17 victim is disabled at the time of the offense;
- 18 (2) the commission of the offense results in serious
- 19 bodily injury to or the death of the person who is trafficked; [or]
- 20 (3) the commission of the offense results in the death
- 21 of an unborn child of the person who is trafficked; or
- 22 (4) the actor:
- 23 (A) used or exhibited a deadly weapon during the
- 24 commission of the offense; or

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- 1 (B) intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly
- 2 impeded the normal breathing or circulation of the blood of the
- 3 trafficked person by applying pressure to the person's throat or
- 4 neck or by blocking the person's nose or mouth.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 20A.02(b-1), Penal Code, as amended by
- 6 Chapters 451 (H.B. 3553) and 452 (H.B. 3554), Acts of the 88th
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, is reenacted and amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (b-1) An offense under this section is a felony of the first
- 10 degree punishable by imprisonment in the Texas Department of
- 11 Criminal Justice for life or for a term of not more than 99 years or
- 12 less than 25 years if it is shown on the trial of the offense that
- 13 the actor committed the offense in a location that was:
- 14 (1) on the premises of or within 1,000 feet of the
- 15 premises of:
- 16 (A) a school; [or]
- 17 (B) an institution of higher education or private
- 18 or independent institution of higher education, as defined by
- 19 Section 61.003, Education Code;
- 20 $\underline{\text{(C)}}$ [\(\frac{\text{(B)}}{\text{B}}\)] a juvenile detention facility;
- 21 $\underline{\text{(D)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(C)}}{\text{)}}$] a post-adjudication secure
- 22 correctional facility;
- 23 $\underline{\text{(E)}}$ [\(\frac{\text{(D)}}{\text{D}}\)] a shelter or facility operating as a
- 24 residential treatment center that serves runaway youth, foster
- 25 children, people who are homeless, or persons subjected to human
- 26 trafficking, domestic violence, or sexual assault;
- (F) $[\frac{E}{E}]$ a community center offering youth

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- 1 services and programs; or
- $\underline{\text{(G)}}$ [(F)] a child-care facility, as defined by
- 3 Section 42.002, Human Resources Code; or
- 4 (2) on the premises where or within 1,000 feet of the
- 5 premises where:
- 6 (A) an official school function was taking place;
- 7 or
- 8 (B) an event sponsored or sanctioned by the
- 9 University Interscholastic League was taking place.
- 10 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 11 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 13 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 14 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 15 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 16 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 17 before that date.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
