## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the period for which a person arrested for certain
- 3 crimes involving family violence may be held after bond is posted.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article 17.291(b), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Article 17.29 does not apply when a person has been
- 8 arrested or held without a warrant in the prevention of family
- 9 violence if there is probable cause to believe the violence will
- 10 continue if the person is immediately released. The head of the
- 11 agency arresting or holding such a person shall [may] hold the
- 12 person for a period of [not more than] four hours after bond has
- 13 been posted. This detention period may be extended for an
- 14 additional period not to exceed 48 hours, but only if authorized in
- 15 a writing directed to the person having custody of the detained
- 16 person by a magistrate who concludes that:
- 17 (1) the violence would continue if the person is
- 18 released; and
- 19 (2) if the additional period exceeds 24 hours,
- 20 probable cause exists to believe that the person committed the
- 21 instant offense and that, during the 10-year period preceding the
- 22 date of the instant offense, the person has been arrested:
- 23 (A) on more than one occasion for an offense
- 24 involving family violence; or

- 1 (B) for any other offense, if a deadly weapon, as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, was used or exhibited during 2 commission of the offense or during immediate flight after 3 4 commission of the offense. SECTION 2. Article 17.291(b), Code of Criminal Procedure, 5 6 as amended by this Act, applies only to a person who is arrested on or after the effective date of this Act. A person arrested before 7 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on 8 the date the person was arrested, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 10
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
