- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Chris Larkin ALS
- 6 Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 1652, Insurance Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Sections 1652.059 and 1652.060 to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 Sec. 1652.059. COVERAGE FOR CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS YOUNGER
- 11 THAN 65. (a) In this section, "entity" means an entity that
- 12 <u>delivers or issues for delivery a Medicare supplement benefit plan</u>
- 13 <u>in this state.</u>
- 14 (b) An entity that offers coverage under a Medicare
- 15 supplement benefit plan to individuals 65 years of age or older must
- 16 offer the same coverage to individuals younger than 65 years of age
- 17 who are eligible for and enrolled in Medicare by reason of end stage
- 18 renal disease or amyotrophic lateral sclerosis.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided by rules adopted under
- 20 <u>Section 1652.051</u>, any benefit, protection, policy, or procedure
- 21 applicable to coverage under a plan for an individual 65 years of
- 22 age or older must apply to coverage offered under Subsection (b).
- 23 <u>(d) A standardized Plan A, Plan B, or Plan D Medicare</u>
- 24 supplement benefit plan offered under Subsection (b) must be

- 1 offered at the same premium rate charged for the plan to an
- 2 individual 65 years of age. A premium rate for a Medicare
- 3 supplement benefit plan offered under Subsection (b), other than
- 4 Plan A, Plan B, or Plan D, may not exceed 200 percent of the premium
- 5 rate charged for the same plan to an individual 65 years of age.
- 6 Sec. 1652.060. ENROLLMENT PERIOD FOR CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS
- 7 YOUNGER THAN 65. (a) In this section, "entity" means an entity
- 8 that delivers or issues for delivery a Medicare supplement benefit
- 9 plan in this state.
- 10 (b) An individual eligible for coverage under a Medicare
- 11 supplement benefit plan under Section 1652.059 may enroll any time
- 12 during the six-month period beginning the first day of the first
- 13 month the individual becomes enrolled for benefits under Medicare
- 14 Part B.
- 15 <u>(c)</u> During an enrollment period, an entity may not, with
- 16 respect to an applicant who is an individual described by
- 17 Subsection (b):
- 18 (1) deny or condition the issuance or effectiveness of
- 19 a Medicare supplement benefit plan or certificate that the entity
- 20 offers and is available for issuance in this state;
- 21 (2) subject the applicant to medical underwriting or
- 22 <u>discriminate in the price of a Medicare supplement benefit plan or</u>
- 23 certificate because of the applicant's health status, claims
- 24 experience, receipt of health care, or medical condition;
- 25 (3) impose a waiting period; or
- 26 (4) impose a limitation or exclusion of benefits based
- 27 on the applicant's preexisting condition.

- 1 (d) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 2 administer this section, including rules designating enrollment
- 3 periods.
- 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 a Medicare supplement benefit plan delivered, issued for delivery,
- 6 or renewed on or after September 1, 2025.
- 7 SECTION 4. In addition to other enrollment periods provided
- 8 by law, an individual younger than 65 years of age and enrolled in
- 9 Medicare Part B by reason of end stage renal disease or amyotrophic
- 10 lateral sclerosis on the effective date of this Act may apply for
- 11 coverage under a Medicare supplement benefit plan:
- 12 (1) after December 1, 2025, and before June 1, 2026; or
- 13 (2) if the individual is unable to submit an
- 14 application for coverage under the plan during the period described
- 15 by Subdivision (1) of this section because the application is not
- 16 available and the individual requested the application during that
- 17 period, during a six-month period beginning on the date the
- 18 application initially becomes available.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
