- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Roman Najera Act.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 822.0421, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (a) If a person reports an incident described by Section
- $10\ 822.041(2)$, the animal control authority may investigate the
- 11 incident. If the animal control authority investigates the
- 12 incident by observing and documenting the behavior of the dog or by
- 13 examining [If , after receiving] the sworn statements of any
- 14 witnesses, the animal control authority:
- 15 (1) may determine [determines] the dog is a dangerous
- 16 dog; and
- 17 (2) for a dog the animal control authority determines
- 18 <u>is a dangerous dog</u>, [the animal control authority] shall notify the
- 19 owner in writing of the determination.
- 20 (e) In this subsection, "identifying information" has the
- 21 meaning assigned by Section 32.51, Penal Code. The identifying
- 22 <u>information of a</u> witness who gives a sworn statement under
- 23 Subsection (a):
- (1) is confidential and not subject to disclosure

- 1 under Chapter 552, Government Code; and
- 2 (2) may be disclosed only for purposes of enforcing
- 3 this chapter to the governing body of the municipality or county in

- 6 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 822, Health and Safety

- 8 <u>Sec. 822.04215.</u> <u>DANGEROUS DOG DETERMINATION IN CERTAIN</u>
- 9 MUNICIPALITIES. (a) This section applies only to a municipality
- 10 containing more than 70 percent of the population of a county with a
- 11 population of 1.5 million or more.
- 12 (b) Notwithstanding Section 822.0421(a), if a person
- 13 reports an incident described by Section 822.041(2)(A) or (B), the
- 14 animal control authority may investigate the incident. If after
- 15 reviewing the sworn statements of any witness or reviewing any
- 16 other applicable reports or information the animal control
- 17 authority determines the dog is a dangerous dog, the animal control
- 18 authority shall notify the owner in writing of the determination.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 822.044, Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to
- 21 read as follows:
- 22 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), an [An] offense
- 23 under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 24 (b-1) An offense under this section is a Class B misdemeanor
- 25 if it is shown on trial of the offense that the defendant has been

- SECTION 5. (a) Section 822.0421(a), Health and Safety

- C.S.H.B. No. 2806
- 1 Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a determination based
- 2 on an incident that occurred on or after the effective date of this
- 3 Act. An incident that occurred before the effective date of this
- 4 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the incident
- 5 occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 6 purpose.
- 7 (b) Section 822.0421(e), Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 8 this Act, applies to information contained in a sworn statement
- 9 released on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of
- 10 whether the sworn statement was made before, on, or after that date.
- 11 SECTION 6. Section 822.04215, Health and Safety Code, as
- 12 added by this Act, applies only to a determination based on an
- 13 incident that occurred on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 14 An incident that occurred before the effective date of this Act is
- 15 governed by the law in effect on the date the incident occurred, and
- 16 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 17 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 18 822.044, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, apply only
- 19 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 20 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 21 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 22 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 23 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 24 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 25 before that date.
- 26 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
