- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 272.001, Business &
- 6 Commerce Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 272.001. <u>CERTAIN</u> [VOIDABLE] CONTRACT <u>PROVISIONS VOID</u>
- 8 [PROVISION].
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 272.001, Business & Commerce Code, is
- 10 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (b) If a construction contract or an agreement collateral to
- 13 or affecting the construction contract contains a provision making
- 14 the contract or agreement or any conflict arising under the
- 15 contract or agreement subject to another state's law, litigation in
- 16 the courts of another state, or arbitration in another state, that
- 17 provision is void as against public policy [voidable by a party
- 18 obligated by the contract or agreement to perform the work that is
- 19 the subject of the construction contract].
- 20 <u>(c) To the extent that a venue provision in a contract is</u>
- 21 void under Subsection (b), unless the parties stipulate to another
- 22 <u>venue after the dispute arises</u>, an action arising out of the
- 23 contract shall be brought only in this state in the county in which
- 24 the property that is the subject of the litigation is located.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 15.020(d), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 2 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 (d) This section does not apply to an action if:
- 4 (1) the agreement described by this section was
- 5 unconscionable at the time that it was made;
- 6 (2) the agreement regarding venue is <u>void</u> [voidable]
- 7 under Chapter 272, Business & Commerce Code; or
- 8 (3) venue is established under a statute of this state
- 9 other than this title.
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 11 a contract that is entered into or renewed on or after the effective
- 12 date of this Act.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
