4	SECTION 1. Section 1301.002(5), Occupations Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(5) "Master plumber" means a person licensed under
7	this chapter who:
8	(A) is skilled in the design, planning, and
9	superintending of plumbing and in the practical installation,
10	repair, and servicing of plumbing;
11	(B) has worked as a journeyman plumber:
12	(i) for at least <u>two</u> [four] years; or
13	(ii) for at least one year and has
14	successfully completed a training program approved by the United
15	States Department of Labor Office of Apprenticeship or another
16	nationally recognized apprentice training program accepted by the
17	board;
18	(C) performs or supervises plumbing work;
19	(D) has passed the required examination; and
20	(E) has fulfilled the other requirements of the
21	board.
22	SECTION 2. As soon practicable after the effective date of
23	this Act, the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners shall adopt

- 2 SECTION 3. Section 1301.002, Occupations Code, as amended
- 3 by this Act, applies only to an application for a master plumber
- 4 license under Chapter 1301, Occupations Code, submitted on or after
- 5 the effective date of this Act. An application submitted before the
- 6 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 7 date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued
- 8 in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
