2	relating to evaluating available resources from certain state
3	agencies to support peer-recovery organizations in this state.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 547, Government Code, as effective April
6	1, 2025, is amended by adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER J. PEER-RECOVERY ORGANIZATIONS
8	Sec. 547.0451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Mental health condition" means a condition, other
10	than a single diagnosis of an intellectual or developmental
11	disability or a substance use disorder, that substantially impairs
12	an individual's:
13	(A) thoughts, perception of reality, emotional
14	process, or judgment;
15	(B) behavior; or
16	(C) ability to participate in daily routines.
17	(2) "Peer-recovery organization" means a nonprofit
18	organization that:
19	(A) is wholly or partly operated by members of
20	the community, with at least 51 percent of those members
21	identifying as persons recovering from substance use disorders or
22	mental health conditions;
23	(B) mobilizes resources from inside and outside
24	of a community to increase the prevalence and quality of recovery

- 1 services for persons with mental health conditions or substance use
- 2 disorders and their affected family members; and
- 3 (C) delivers peer support services provided by
- 4 persons recovering from a substance use disorder or mental health
- 5 condition.
- 6 (3) "Substance use disorder" means the recurrent use
- 7 of alcohol or drugs that causes significant clinical and functional
- 8 impairment, such as health problems, disability, and failure to
- 9 complete major responsibilities at work, school, or home.
- 10 Sec. 547.0452. ASSISTANCE FROM CERTAIN STATE AGENCIES. The
- 11 following state agencies shall identify available resources,
- 12 including funding, training, or technical assistance, to support
- 13 and sustain peer-recovery organizations in this state:
- 14 (1) the Health and Human Services Commission;
- 15 (2) the Department of State Health Services;
- 16 (3) the Department of Family and Protective Services;
- 17 (4) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
- 18 Affairs;
- 19 (5) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
- 20 (6) the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; and
- 21 (7) the Texas Veterans Commission.
- Sec. 547.0453. BIENNIAL REPORT. Not later than August 1 of
- 23 <u>each even-numbered year</u>, each state agency listed in Section
- 24 547.0452 shall prepare and submit a written report to the
- 25 legislature describing and detailing the available resources the
- 26 state agency has available to provide to peer-recovery
- 27 organizations in this state.
