## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to certification requirements for a fire marshal and any
3	related employee, officer, inspector, and investigator appointed
4	by certain counties and emergency services districts.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter $F$ , Chapter $775$ , Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 775.1025 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 775.1025. CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR DISTRICTS
9	LOCATED IN CERTAIN COUNTIES. (a) This section applies only to a
10	district wholly located in a county with a population of 100,000 or
11	more.
12	(b) The fire marshal shall hold the following
13	certifications issued by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection:
14	(1) head of a prevention-only fire department
15	certification not later than 12 months after the date the marshal is
16	initially appointed;
17	(2) a fire marshal basic certification not later than
18	24 months after the date the marshal is initially appointed; and
19	(3) a fire protection personnel certification not
20	later than 12 months after the date the marshal is initially
21	appointed.
22	(c) If acting as a peace officer, the fire marshal and any
23	related officer, inspector, and investigator must hold a permanent
23	related officer, inspector, and investigator must hold a perma

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peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code.

- 1 (d) If acting under fire marshal authority to conduct or
- 2 supervise arson investigations or fire inspections, the fire
- 3 marshal or the marshal's employees must hold certifications
- 4 required for fire inspection by the Texas Commission on Fire
- 5 Protection under Chapter 419, Government Code.
- 6 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Local Government
- 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 352.0125 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 352.0125. CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS IN CERTAIN
- 9 COUNTIES. (a) This section applies only to a county with a
- 10 population of 100,000 or more.
- 11 (b) A county fire marshal shall hold the following
- 12 certifications issued by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection:
- (1) head of a prevention-only fire department
- 14 certification not later than 12 months after the date the marshal is
- 15 <u>initially appointed;</u>
- 16 (2) a fire marshal basic certification not later than
- 17 24 months after the date the marshal is initially appointed; and
- 18 (3) a fire protection personnel certification not
- 19 later than 12 months after the date the marshal is initially
- 20 appointed.
- 21 <u>(c) If acting as a peace officer, a county fire marshal and</u>
- 22 any related officer, inspector, and investigator must hold a
- 23 permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701,
- 24 Occupations Code.
- 25 (d) If acting under fire marshal authority to conduct or
- 26 supervise arson investigations or fire inspections, a county fire
- 27 marshal or the marshal's employees must hold certifications

- 1 required for fire inspection by the Texas Commission on Fire
- 2 Protection under Chapter 419, Government Code.
- 3 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Sections 775.1025, Health and
- 4 Safety Code, and 352.0125, Local Government Code, as added by this
- 5 Act, a fire marshal for a county with a population of 100,000 or
- 6 more or for an emergency services district wholly located in a
- 7 county with a population of 100,000 or more initially appointed
- 8 before the effective date of this Act must receive the following
- 9 certifications:
- 10 (1) head of a suppression fire department
- 11 certification issued by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection not
- 12 later than 12 months after the effective date of this Act;
- 13 (2) head of a prevention-only fire department
- 14 certification issued by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection not
- 15 later than 12 months after the effective date of this Act;
- 16 (3) a fire marshal basic certification issued by the
- 17 Texas Commission on Fire Protection not later than 24 months after
- 18 the effective date of this Act;
- 19 (4) a fire protection personnel certification issued
- 20 by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection not later than 12 months
- 21 after the effective date of this Act; and
- 22 (5) if acting as a peace officer, a permanent peace
- 23 officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
